

SSCBS gets National Accreditations

NAAC: (National Assessment and Accreditation Council)



The NAAC peer team visited the college campus during 27-29 January 2016. The college Accredited with a CGPA of 3.16 on a four point scale at A Grade valid for a period of five years from 19/02/2016. The original certificate of accreditation with the quality profile is awaited.

AICTE: (All India Council for Technical Education)

The AICTE accreditation process was initiated in 2015 for the B.Tech. (Computer Science) program. AICTE team has visited the college campus and approved the B.Tech. (Computer Science) course to run in the same premises/campus in the field of technical education.

Introduction of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective/minor or skill based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India to begin with and across countries. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates.

SSCBS to have Start-up Incubation Centre

Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies has been selected by the Govt. of NCT of Delhi for setting up an Incubation Centre for promoting Entrepreneurship. It is one of the 6 Delhi based institutions and the only undergraduate college chosen. The college has been given an initial grant of ₹ 1.5 Crore by the Govt. The amount was handed over to the Principal by the Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister of Delhi, Sh. Manish Sisodia at distribution ceremony in the Delhi Secretariat on 07th March, 2016. Students from the Entrepreneurship Society of the college (Yuva) also represented the college and shared their experiences with their own start-ups. The college aims utilise these funds to promote entrepreneurship and entrepreneurial ventures among the students of the college and beyond in an inclusive and beneficial manner.

Entrepreneurial Ventures that deserve an Applaud

- 1. <u>Instago:</u> One of the major success stories of the past year, Instago was started by Nakul Khanna and Anmol Ahlawat, both ex members of YUVA. Instago is a meta cab aggregator service that raised an Angel level round of funding last year. Yuva has been actively involved with Instago, helping them not only in terms of publicity through our social media outlets but also generate downloads by directly assisting their on-ground marketing efforts.
- 2. <u>Notebookd:</u> Started up by present YUVA president, Mayank Manchanda, Notebookd aimed to help students learn better by making a platform wherein students could freely share their class notes with each other. The start-up is presently bootstrapping
- 3. <u>Contyxt:</u> Run by another Yuva alumni, Contyxt is a data analytics start-up that helps people customise their Facebook newsfeed so that they can utilise their time spent online better. Yuva assisted Contyxt to raise their first round of pre-seed funding last year when some present Yuva members introduced Contyxt to a set of investors.
- 4. <u>Diskount Karde:</u> Run by Harshit Joshi, DKD is a consumer tech firm that boasts of clients like ISL and Pune IPL team amongst others. It raised a round of 5 million rupees, which has helped it sustain itself.
- 5. <u>Surpy:</u> Run by Ankit Saini, Surpy is an offbeat micro event management start-up already catering to a number of clients.
- 6. <u>**BLT:**</u> Run by Durgesh Rawat, Akhil, Alankrita Mitra, Ankit Saini and Ayush Mohanty; BLT deals in providing educational trips to students. Eduventure, as we call it, enables the participants to realise the start-up culture. Also will soon come up with a magazine.



SSCBS gets to participate in UK-India Education and Research Initiative (UKIERI-2015)

The college participated in the UK-India Education and the Research Initiative (UKIERI), an initiative of University of Delhi. As a part of the initiative students from United Kingdom Universities, such as London School of Economics, University of Edinburgh, Kings College, University College London and University of Manchester among others, visited the college. This year 48 students from UK Universities visited the college on August 27 to August 29, 2015.

The visiting students were exposed to the teaching pedagogy and class room environment. They attended a workshop on dramatics and street play and participated in an information technology quiz. The college societies like Kriti (creative society), Verve (street play society), Dhwani (music society) and Blitz (dance society) showcased their performances for the visitors. The UK students keenly participated and joined in the dance performances and in rangoli making.

A visit to Dilli Haat at INA Market, Delhi was arranged for them. This exposed them to Indian culture and handicrafts. The UK Students showed keen interest in the handicrafts and were excited about carrying souvenirs back home.

The UK students also visited the production centre of Project Akshar (social initiative project of the college) at Maidan Garhi, Delhi. The students interacted with the beneficiaries of the projectdrug rehabilitation and human trafficking victims. They showed their support for the cause by buying Akshar notebook made of recycled paper, the proceeds of which go to the rehabilitated victims.

Subsequently as part of the UKIERI – SIP (Study India Program) two students of the college will be visiting the United Kingdom in June 2015. They are likely to visit Oxford University, London School of Economics, Oxford Brookes University and House of Parliament amongst others.

Strengthening the Financial Literacy

The college signed collaborated with NSE and BSE to create Financial Ambience and thus Financial Literacy and to develop Financial Mission Centre at the college premises.

Certificate courses were initiated to encourage students to come forward and keenly participate in the activities. NSE Certified Capital Markets Professional (NCCMP) course gave the students certification in Capital Market Dealer Module. On the other hand, the college, under the partnership with BSE offered a course in Market Basics and Algorithmic (Algo) trading for undergraduate students in the Delhi/NCR region. The course content had been developed using inputs from the BSE, faculty of the college, students of the college and industry professionals amongst other stakeholders and focused on holistic development of the students in the finance field.

It aimed to have a holistic approach by including a relatively neglected but important aspect of team research, namely team goal commitment or the team members attachment to the team goal. All the innovation projects allotted to the college have been successfully completed. A number of workshops and seminars were held to emphasize and educate others about the ideas and the output of these projects.

Research papers from the innovation projects have been presented and published in renowned conferences and journals.

2. Sensitization Using Theatre: The Goal is to sensitize the student community about various social issues. Context SSCBS organizes an annual street play festival "Manthan" wherein it joins hands with the street theatre societies of colleges across the globe. It is an effort to transform the mindset of the viewers with a belief that the power to do so lies within them. Practice From its humble beginnings at the Jantar Mantar in 2007 with just three performances, it has today evolved into the largest street theatre festival in India with an International footprint. In its 10th iteration, Manthan reached out to an audience, larger than 5 lakh, across 45 cities in Brazil, Russia, Nigeria, Nepal, and India. Evidence of Success SSCBS has developed street plays on themes such as whistle blowing, civic sense indifference, political consciousness, religious fanaticism, censorship of art, and Naxalism.
