Internet access and required software are available. Research facilities by the college need to be further strengthened.
2.3.4 research publications and Awards	 104 research articles in international, 61 in national journals have been published by the faculty members. 36 conference proceedings & some chapter in books have been published by faculty members.
2.3.5 Consultancy	 Consultancy activities need to be initiated.
2.3.6 Extension Activities and Institutional Social Responsibilities	 Extension activities such as awareness on some social issues in collaboration with NSS and NGOs are undertaken. Extension activities such as blood donation camps, collection drive, Wish-Tree, inclusive society, have been initiated in collaboration with NGO. Some students of the college got recognition for various activities at national and international level. Outreach programmes to benefit local community need to be strengthened.

College has 26 Classrooms, 5 Computer Labs and three multipurpose rooms with ICT facilities. Staff room & canteen facility available. Shortly the college is being shifted in newly constructed building with all State of the Art infrastructure and facilities in Rohini Sector 16, Delhi.
2.4.2 Library as a Learning Resource	 Library has more than 20,000 books along with magazines and journals. Reprographic facilities are available. Library has access to e-resource/e-journals through DELNET,DULS, INFLIBNET/IUC facilities. Library uses KOHA for automation of library system.
2.4.3 IT Infrastructure	 166 Desktop computers, 03 servers spread over in different labs and administrative offices and Library. 499 laptops are provided to students, teachers and other Office staff. All classrooms are equipped with LCD Projectors, 16 printers, 03 scanners and software as per requirements. Wi-Fi enabled campus.
