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Message from the Principal

I feel immense pride in presenting the 36th annual report of Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies. Having started our journey as the first college in University of Delhi to offer a degree program in Business Studies, which is now named as Bachelor of Management Studies, we have come a long way, overcoming challenges, learning with new experiences, and creating history. Our mantra - perseverance and commitment to quality – has been bringing us laurels, and we have been recognized as the best undergraduate college by India Today yet again in June 2023, making it the 4thtime in a row. Also, we have been graded 'A+' by National Accreditation Assessment Council. Today, SSCBS offers, threeunder-graduate(honours) programs, namely Bachelorof Management Studies, Bachelor of Business



Administration (Financial Investment Analysis) and Bachelor of Science in Computer Science, which is also a highly sought after course, a post graduate program in Cyber Security and Law, and other certification courses namely Data Analytics and Business Intelligence, Digital Marketing, Financial Modeling and Algo Trading, NSE Academy Certified Capital Market Professional, and FinTech.

We have a placement cell that works dedicatedly to get the best job opportunities for our students.We also have a government-supported incubation center to extend infrastructure and seed funding to innovative new ideas. On the placements front, this year, we witnessed an influx of reputed companies, leading to successful student placements. We focused on bringing firms for diverse roles including consulting, private equity, investment banking, FMCG, venture capitalist, data analytics, trading. A total of 78 companies visited the campus this year, out of which 19 were new. We are delighted to share that the highest CTC offered reached an impressive 44.45 LPA, marking a remarkable 23% increase compared to the previous year. Additionally, the average CTC stood at 11.11 LPA, reflecting a substantial 12.4% growth from last year. We are proud to have prominent recruiters like Boston Consulting Group, AbinBev, Bain Capability Network, D.E Shaw Group, LEK, McKinsey Knowledge Centre, Wells Fargo, Xander and Alvarez and Marsal, reflecting the recognition and value of our institution. We focus on getting quality summer internships for students. Fireside Ventures and ICICI Prudential offered the highest stipend at 1 lac/month. McKinsey provided 75K, D.E Shaw Group offered 60K, and FTI Consulting provided 45K per month. Approximately 70% of students secured internships with stipends.

The year 2022-23 was an important year in the history of the nation as well as the University of Delhi. As the whole nation celebrated the 75th year of independence - Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, and took pride in holding the G20 presidency, the university celebrated its centenary year and implemented the National Education Policy 2020. SSCBS wholeheartedly participated in the celebrations, took up the new challenges, and in all respects shared the spirit and pride of the nation and the university.

Our students have been winning accolades at both global and national levels. This year, our students secured podium finishes at prestigious international and national level case competitions while competing against some of the world's best universities, including Harvard, MIT, Stanford, NUS and Hong Kong University.

Besides instilling leadership and entrepreneurial skills in our students, we nurture them to become responsible citizens and compassionate humans. Many student societies are engaged in outreach and extension activities wherein they identify and contribute to alleviate social and environmental problems. We also care for our students' overall well-being. Having recovered from the challenging pandemic times, we empathize with the youth who have been impacted socially, emotionally and mentally. Resonating with the need of the hour, we have appointed a counselor, a practicing clinical psychologist, to take care of the emotional and psychological aspects of our students' health.

We are evolving each day and hope to take some more significant steps for betterment in coming years.





Shaheed Sukhdev Thapar Freedom Fighter (15th May 1907 - 23rd March 1931)

Biography

Sukhdev Thapar was an Indian freedom fighter. Born in Ludhiana Sukhdev, since his childhood, was a witness to several atrocities that the Imperial British Raj had inflicted on India, which led him to become a freedom fighter. Sukhdev, along with other renowned freedom fighters, started the Naujawan Bharat Sabha gearing the youth to join the freedom struggle. He is best remembered for his involvement in the Lahore Conspiracy Case (18th December 1928) and its aftermath that shook the foundation of the British Government. After the Central Assembly Hall bombings in Delhi (8th April 1929) Sukhdev and his associates were arrested and hanged on 23rd March 1931. Sukhdev Thapar became a martyr at a young age of 24 years to pay homage and tribute to the three brave freedom fighters namely, Shri Sukhdev Thapar, Shri Shivram Rajguru and Shri Bhagat Singh, the National Social Scheme of Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies celebrated Shaheed Diwas on 23rd March, 2022

When someone sacrifices themselves for their nation, they always leave behind an unforgettable legacy. Commemorating the courage and indelible impression of the three heroes, every year 23rd March is observed as Shaheed Diwas.

About the College

Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies (SSCBS) is one of the premier institutions of the University of Delhi, imparting path-breaking education in the fields of Management and Information Technology. It was established in August 1987 by the Government of the National Capital Territory of Delhi (GNCTD) on the initiation of University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Ministry of Human Resources and Development, Government of India (MHRD).

At present, the college offers three full-time graduate programs under its three departments -Departments of Management Studies (DMS) and Department of Computer Science (DCS) leading to the award of Bachelor of Management Studies, Bachelor of Business Administration (Financial Investment Analysis) and B.Sc. (H) Computer Science.

The college also offers a post graduate diploma course in Cyber Security and Law. The college emphasizes an interactive mode of education, supported with innovative teaching methodologies. It is designed to stimulate inquiring minds and provide significant exposure to the realities of business processes and challenges. Industry interaction is achieved through guest lectures, industrial tours, industry-based project work, live projects, internships and summer training. The strength of the college lies in its highly qualified faculty having industrial experience, dynamic students, supportive non-teaching staff, illustrious alumni and a supportive and encouraging governing body.

The college supports about 45 student societies working in diverse areas including strengthening students' skills in various domains (such as marketing, finance, technology and entrepreneurship), social outreach, mental and emotional health, environment etc.

The high standards of excellence give SSCBS the phenomenal and undeniable edge we are recognized for. These standards are endlessly pushed beyond the horizon. At SSCBS, we are never content. The inverse correlation between our satisfaction and our progress is an acknowledged and appointed theory at SSCBS. This is the SSCBS difference.

Programs

Bachelor of Management Studies

Head of the Department: Dr. Nidhi Kesari

Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS) is an under-graduate programme imparting education in management. The duration of the course is three years. Under New Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the students will have the flexibility of completing the course in four years as well. The course was originally known as Bachelor of Business Studies (BBS), when it was first introduced by University of Delhi in 1987. The course allows students to obtain the knowledge and skills needed to assume management positions in a wide range of organizations. Students are also motivated to go for summer internships to gain practical insight from industry which makes their course content more meaningful.

Bachelor of Science (H) Computer Science

The computer science department at Shaheed Sukhdev college of Business Studies has the objective of imparting quality education in the field of Computer Science. With the rapidly evolving technology and the continuous need for innovation, the college offers modern facilities for teaching, learning and research. The B.Sc. (H) Computer Science programme is designed to develop analytical & computational thinking, and problem-solving skills. The programme provides rigorous foundations of the concepts of Computer Science and its applications.

Bachelor of Business Administration (Financial Investment Analysis) BBA(FIA)

Bachelor of Business Administration (Financial Investment Analysis) is a core finance course, exposes you to all important concepts from Financial management to derivatives, from statistics to economics which are the basis for going forward and making a career in this field. The program is focused to create financial expertise to contribute to emerging India. This program is a true value addition in professional education in the field of finance at an early stage of under graduation.

Post Graduate Diploma in Cyber Security and Law (PGDCSL)

Program Coordinator: Dr. Anamika Gupta

Post Graduate Diploma in Cyber Security and Law (PGDCSL) program is an advanced Penetration Testing & Information Security Training Engineering Program: The course provides an intensive training which will empower an individual with practical knowledge in a simplified and easily graspable manner. In the course, students will learn how hackers break into the systems, network, mobiles and website so as to make them aware of the possible loopholes and therefore, making them proficient in reverse-penetration.

Student Enrollment

This year the admission process to BMS and BBA (FIA) Programs was done through Common University Entrance Test (CUET) in an online mode. The students seeking admission to BMS and BBA(FIA) programs were required to appear in one language from List A, Mathematics/Applied Mathematics, and General Test. The end selection was based on the rank computed from the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects. The written entrance test was conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). Overall, 297 students were admitted in BMS and 145 students in BBA(FIA).

The admission to B. Sc. (H) Computer Science was conducted through Central University Entrance Test (CUET) online for the academic session 2022-23. The students seeking admission to B.Sc. (H) Computer Science was required to appear in one language from List A, Mathematics, and two other subjects (one from list B1). The selection was based on the rank computed from the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects. After allotment of the students to college, the Admissions committee verified all the documents online and completed the admission process. In total, 67 students were admitted to the B. Sc. (H) Computer Science course. Admission to PGDCSL requires a Bachelors or above in Science or Technology with following papers:

Programming, Networking, Database management, Operating Systems, and Data Structure. The admissions are based on the merit drawn based on the marks obtained in eligible degrees. Altogether, 38 students were admitted in PGDCSL

Major Highlights

IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell)

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is an integral part of SSCBS. Constituted under the aegis of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) requirements, the IQAC includes representatives of all stakeholders, viz., Administration, Faculty, Students, Alumni and Recruiters; who work together to enhance the learning environment in the college.

Diverse opinions add to the perspectives of the IQAC. In 2022-23, IQAC was supplemented by the viewpoints of multi-talented individuals including Dr. S.S. Guglani, Mr. Tushar Dhiman, Dr. Arvinder Kaur and Dr. Kavita Sharma (as Management nominees); Dr. Meenu (as Parent representative); Mr. Aditya Arora (as Alumnus of SSCBS); and Mr. Anand K. Chaturvedi (as Employer).

Additionally, as part of various initiatives, IQAC and SSCBS invites eminent resource persons from the industry and academia who share their insights and experiences to help raise the academic and operational processes and standards of the college. During the past year, IQAC has had three formal meetings with all the stakeholders to help to decide upon and take action on a Road Map to improve the quality of college functioning and take stock of the progress made on various aspects of the road map.

Though IQAC is involved with almost all aspects of the college, it has taken some special actions during 2022-23 with the aim of improving the academic and operational activities in the college.

1. Mentoring, Counseling and related

IQAC has initiated a set of programs to help students cope with the various stresses that they face. SSCBS continues to run a mentorship program wherein students of the college can choose to be mapped to a faculty member with whom they can be in touch as a guide and support mechanism to help them cope better and work on any concerns that they may be facing on their professional and personal fronts.

Furthermore, the college also runs a Counseling program, wherein a qualified counselor, Ms. Anisha Batra comes to the college regularly and students, faculty members and staff members can book appointments with her for counseling sessions.

Additionally, the students of the college have started a mental health initiative whereby they help current students connect with their seniors and alumni to share their problems and seek support and guidance.

Overall, these initiatives help to reduce stress levels in the students which in turn helps improve their quality of life, academic retention and general outlook to life.

2. Implementation of NEP and Continuous Assessment mechanism

In line with the UGC directives, the college (as part of the University of Delhi) has successfully implemented New Education Policy 2022 (NEP) from the 2022-23 academic year starting from November 2022.

Under NEP, new papers, syllabi, pedagogy and (Continuous) assessment methods have been introduced. The IQAC is proud to say that with the efforts of all the faculty members, staff and students of the college, NEP implementation in SSCBS has taken place in a smooth and productive manner, keeping the spirit of the NEP at the forefront.

Furthermore, the college has created and operationalized a new method (using paper records, online record keeping and sensitization of the stakeholders) for running the Continuous Assessment system as envisaged under the NEP. This allows for regular assessment, record keeping and performance tracking so that both the students and faculty members can keep track of the academic performance of the students in each class. Putting all this online on the college's own ERP system has greatly helped reduce the operational burden and free up time for the actual learning activities that are being done under this continuous assessment system.

3. SSCBS is the Nodal College for Cluster Colleges West by DU for AEC for 1st year students Thanks to the efforts of all its stakeholders, SSCBS continues to enjoy a stellar reputation amongst its peers and within the DU system as a college with efficient processes and activities.

Keeping these in mind, the DU nominated SSCBS to serve the Nodal College for the Cluster Colleges (West); an initiative whereby the DU has divided all its colleges in 4 geographic clusters with the aim that these colleges will support each other and serve as resource multiplier; given that each college has its own unique strengths and infrastructural capabilities. Additionally, delegating the operational activities of the AEC (Ability Enhancement courses), SEC (Skill Enhancement courses) and VAC (Value Added courses) to Nodal colleges improves coordination and delivery.

4 SSCBS faculty members have been serving as Nodal Officers and Coordinators for these 3 course groups, serving as liaisons between 13 colleges in the cluster and the University administration on topics such as papers offered, operational aspects and future proofing.

IQAC initiatives have been designed to help improve the quality of learning within the college; and with the unstinted support of all stakeholders, IQAC initiatives have grown and hopefully will continue to grow in quality, quantity and stature within the SSCBS fraternity and the larger DU community.

NIRF

The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) was approved by the MHRD and launched by the Honorable Minister of Human Resource Development on 29th September 2015. This framework outlines a methodology to rank institutions across the country. The methodology draws from the overall recommendations arrived at by a Core Committee, set up by MHRD, to identify the broad parameters for ranking various universities and institutions. Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies has been ranked in the top 100 in the NIRF ranking 2023 (College).

India Today

Rankings of professional and academic institutions, though existing for many decades, have taken even greater importance in today's complex and dynamic environment. In the spirit of transparency and accountability towards the stakeholders, it is pertinent to separate the wheat from the chaff and bring the best professional institutions in the country out of almost 50,000 colleges and institutes spread across the length and breadth of the country.

IIC is one of the initiatives under the Ministry of Education Innovation Cell (MIC). Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies is one of the innovation cells. They engage faculty, students and staff in various activities such as: Ideation, Problem solving, Proof of Concept development, Design Thinking, IPR, Project handling, Management at Pre-incubation/Incubation stage, etc. so that innovation and entrepreneurship ecosystem gets established and stabilized in HEIs. Different kinds of activities are conducted. Secondly, MIC DRIVEN ACTIVITIES are such activities conducted on its own or in collaboration with partner organizations and government departments. Our campus is spread over 5 acres with the latest amenities. A split-level 500+ seater auditorium supported with 4 well-equipped seminar halls are for events. 35 air-conditioned classrooms, all equipped with the latest AV equipment, focus on learning and enhance quality of interaction. A two-level well stocked library provides an opportunity for studying, while an amphi-theatre exists for student activities. There are air-conditioned hostel rooms, cafeteria-cum-mess area, administrative and common use areas and faculty rooms. A large underground parking lot, residential accommodation for faculty/staff members, an in-house STP plant, and a weather station are also present.

There are six computer labs, exclusive examination rooms, nine dedicated tutorial rooms, separate faculty rooms, an entire floor with an in-house incubation centre and a placement cell. We also have a separate alumni relations cell.

Monitored CCTV cameras, gated security systems and well displayed and maintained fire and safety systems ensure safety, while ramps, lifts and other systems ensure that students/faculty with all manner of physical capabilities can access the facilities comfortably. The rooftop solar plant and solar water heaters support our environmental commitments in tandem with energy efficient building materials and tactics.

Facilities for Sports and Cultural Activities

The college accords high importance to the physical well-being and cultural expression of the students. The half-acre playground is well used by the students to partake in a wide-range of outdoor sports like football, cricket, volleyball, kabaddi, etc. Indoor sports facilities support sporting activities such as table tennis, carrom and chess. The college grounds also have a fully-equipped open gymnasium.

One end of the college grounds hosts a huge open-air stage that is used for practices of cultural events. It becomes the centerpiece of large open-air events, noticeably Crescendo, the annual cultural fest of the college. The grounds also play host to numerous other significant events such as Alumni meets, food fests and such like.

Akash Ganga, the college auditorium is fully air-conditioned, seats more than 500 people and is set up to conduct a variety of cultural events, conferences and discussions. More focussed activities can make use of any of the 4 similarly equipped but slightly smaller (at approximately 100 seats) seminar rooms. At the other end, a garlanded bust of our namesake, Shaheed Sukhdev Thapar and the gaily fluttering national flag provide a touch of poignancy and help to channelize our efforts for greater national good.

Library as a Learning Resource


The library is located on the second floor of the college. It is spread over two floors covering an area of approx. 1161 sq.m. and has designated space for reading rooms for 218 students and a research section for faculty members.

Library has institutional memberships of NLIST and DELNET and students are encouraged to make use of its e-resources. Library shares digital resources in the form of online magazines, journals and newspaper clippings along with the useful links to the articles with the users. In addition, e-books accessible through NLIST were shared with the faculty members in their respective subject area.

All college library activities such as circulation, technical processing, serial control and system administration are automated using the cloud based Open-Source Solution i.e. KOHAversion 22.05.03.000 It provides easy access to the library catalogue (OPAC) from anywhere anytime. It enables students, faculty and staff members to check the status of the library resources and also maintains transparency in all the transactions by providing access to their personal accounts. In addition, Library is providing the online renewal facility for the students using the following link http://sscbs.bestbookbuddies.com/ We are one of the leading college libraries of University of Delhi using KOHA Open Source Integrated library management software shifted from LIBTEK DOS based library software since May 2014.

The library verifies its stock every year using the bar-code technology. Library has created and regularly updating its portal,<u>https://sites.google.com/sscbsdu.ac.in/sscbslibrary/home</u> which assimilates useful resources and serves as a gateway to easy access to a wide variety of resources like Web based OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue), E-Resources, Rare Books,

Syllabus, Question Papers and Annual Reports along with the Blog etc. Question Papers are arranged Paper-wise under its Semester & Year-wise under each program to provide one point easy access to the students and faculty. It has QR Code for the Library Website for fast access through smart devices.

Number per day usage of the library was calculated considering the physical footfalls of 159 students per day and login data for online access to e-resources ((NLIST, DELNET, OPAC, and Library Website) by teachers and students is 192 students per day.

Apart from the print resources, teaching and research is also supported by accessing the large number of electronic resources (e-journals, e-books and databases) accessible through IP- based and Remote Access facility of DU eLibrary. It also provides access to eShodhSindhu resources accessible through DULS. The library has an Institutional membership of Developing Library Network (DELNET) and N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content). Awareness of online resources such as Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ), Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB), Internet Archives, eShodhganga and National Digital Library with the faculty members and students were shared.

Library Internship was given to three interns for the period of three months to make them learn the functionality of the library services.

IT Infrastructure

The college has six well-equipped modern computer laboratories, two for the BMS students, two for the B.Sc.(H) Computer Science students, one for the BFIA students and one for PGDCSL students. The College maintains and upgrades its IT infrastructure on a regular basis. The college has in total 26 printers and 712 computers which include 679 computers available for academic purposes. All computer laboratories are equipped with LCD projectors. Two internet connections, one from Delhi University with a speed of 250 Mbps and another from MTNL with a speed of 1000 Mbps, are available through LAN and Wi-Fi in the whole campus. The college has access to many licensed and open-source software such as Dev C++, CPUSim 4.0, MS Excel, TORA, Ubuntu, Anaconda, Mathematica / Scilab, Eclips, Turbo Assembler, NetBeans, Prolog, Xamp, Notepad++, Oracle, Android Studio, SPSS, Capital Line, Microsoft Office, E views, Windows Server 2016, MySQL, Visual Studio, Google GSuite for Education, Tally, and Adobe Acrobat Pro. These softwares are also updated as per the changing need of the academic curriculum. All college library activities are automated using the cloud based Open-Source Solution, Koha which ensure 24*7 access from anywhere. The college website provides a platform for students to view their attendance and internal assessment on a real time basis. For better connectivity the college has an intercom facility (EPABX) and the college also ensures safety of all individuals in the campus with the help of CCTV surveillance through 94 cameras.

Participation in Global Entrepreneurship Mindset Program-Kobe

Two of our students, Vishesh Gupta and Sakshi Sharma from BBA(FIA),were the only two students selected from India to participate in an Inter-university Exchange Program, spanning 10 days in Kobe, Japan. This program was a fully-funded initiative that prioritized fostering entrepreneurship among talented individuals from Japan, Australia, India, the United Kingdom, and Canada. Orchestrated by Kansai University of International Studies and Innovation Dojo, a Kobe-based Venture Capital & Private Equity firm, its overarching goals encompassed not only bolstering global university cooperation but also forging strong alliances with startup support entities, governmental bodies, and established enterprises. Through curated speaker sessions, panel discussions, and immersive industry visits to esteemed entities like Pasona Group Inc. Global Network, KOBE Biomedical Innovation Cluster, and ACALL, this endeavor facilitated a dynamic exchange of insights, knowledge, and experiences, cultivating a robust and innovative talent reservoir.

Besides sponsorship that included all airfares, accommodation, entrance fees, transport costs as well as the access to all events and workshops, our students were awarded a scholarship amounting to 1,60,000 yen (80,000 yen per student) under the JASSO program of the Japanese government for foreign students. Additionally, in a startup pitch competition, both Sakshi Sharma and Vishesh Gupta were rewarded with prize money as their startup ideas were amongst the best 3 startups who pitched there.

Convergence 2022 truly emerged as a transformative platform, uniting leaders and students to delve deep into the realm of embracing change and transformation. The event inspired attendees to acknowledge change as an indispensable element of life's journey and encouraged them to adapt, thrive, and harness the opportunities that an ever-evolving world presents. By embracing change wholeheartedly and embracing the boundless possibilities it offers, the summit has set the stage for a future marked by unprecedented growth and remarkable success.

Crescendo

Crescendo, the annual fest of SSCBS, was held on 18th and 19th April 2023.

Crescendo'23 set the stage the CBS Business Championship. With a prize pool of over 1.5 lakhs-The CBS Business Championship, featured a series of 19 events, including 15 business competitions and 4 workshops. These competitions spanned diverse fields like marketing, entrepreneurship, law, finance, and more. Academic societies within SSCBS collaborated to organize the event, bringing together students from various disciplines to showcase their talents and skills. Crescendo '23 also hosted the college prom evening and performances by singer Siddhant Singh, DJ Ravator, Rapper Kalbaisakhi X Kainto and bollywood playback singer Mohammed Irfan.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

Best Practice 1 A student-run organization dedicated to solving environmental and social problems through entrepreneurial action, aiming for the betterment of people, prosperity, and the planet.

Objective: Enactus SSCBS, a student-run organization, adeptly identifies humanitarian and environmental needs and addresses them through the development of ingenious social business solutions. Embodying a comprehensive three-fold objective of economic, social, and environmental betterment, the team firmly believes in its capacity to be the catalyst of change that the world requires. The team's unwavering dedication lies in fostering transformative changes through businesses that uplift communities and make a substantial impact on shaping a better future. With an operational history spanning 14 years, Enactus SSCBS has consistently pursued the positive potential of business solutions to empower the underprivileged and drive socio-economic development.

Context: Enactus SSCBS is currently working on 4 primary socio-environmental needs:

- 1. Paper Waste: According to the United Nations (FAO), consumption of paper around the world has increased by 200% in the past 40 years, estimated to double by 2030. However, this production has grave consequences. 10% of worldwide deforestation is caused by the paper and pulp industry, which is the fourth largest greenhouse emitter, contributing to severe climate change. The World Wildlife Fund lists the paper industry among the top 5 drivers of biodiversity loss. Globally, more than 400 million tons of waste paper are generated each year. India recovers (only) 25-28% of this waste.
- 2. Inefficient NGOs: India has over 3.3 million NGOs which empower more than 600 million people, who rely on them for fundamental needs such as basic education and healthcare. Over 70% of them face adequate infrastructure in addition to 90% lack financial security, with only less than 5 lakhs INR for their annual operations. Moreover, 80% of the NGOs are understaffed and 35% are deprived of basic facilities like clean water and a regular power supply.
- 3. Textile waste generation: Textiles take up over 5% of landfill space globally and lie untreated for over 200 years, releasing toxic fumes like methane and nitrous oxide. The textile industry produces over 45000 meters of fabric waste daily, becoming the world's second-largest polluter. Textile production consumes almost 80% energy used in the fashion industry annually. It accounts for 35% of the 1.5 million tons of microplastics in the oceans. The global textile and clothing industries alone are responsible for 79 billion cubic meters of water consumption and over 1,700 million tonnes of carbon dioxide emission.
- 4. Homelessness: People residing in the homeless shelter are deprived of basic amenities like sanitation and security and have to live in the gloomy conditions of the shelter with minimal opportunities. Without financial security or a reliable income source, they have to face exploitation in the informal sector. Over 2 lakh homeless people living on the streets of Delhi or in shelters have similar stories.

Practice: Each Enactus project starts with a vision to outcast a social problem and empower

communities in the process. Enactus SSCBS is currently working on 2 diverse projects while empowering multiple communities.

1. Project Kaagazi

Project Kaagazi aims to combat the issue of Paper waste, through a 3-fold collection approach including partnering with organizations to assess the waste generation, collecting it through customized paper bins, and finally segregating it into recyclable and non-recyclable paper waste. Further on, a two-pronged approach is followed with the recyclable paper being converted into hand-designed recycled Notebooks, and the non-recyclable paper waste upcycled into photo frames and paper lamps by our entrepreneurs. We have incentivized our partnered organizations to monitor and segregate their paper waste into recyclable and non-recyclable waste.

2. Project Kshitij

Project Kshitij aims to restructure the NGOs, ultimately creating self-sufficient organizations. It is achieved through our two-fold approach of revitalizing them with infrastructural improvements, filling the gaps of untrained staff with our training module, and improving their financial standing by creating a business model for them, while employing the residents at the shelters of these NGOs. This is done under our 2 verticals:

- A. Saarthi: Herein, the NGOs are restructured with upliftment in infrastructure, training, and fulfillment of the gap of staff required, standardizing, and improving education imparted to children by them, and ensuring steady food supply with Zomato's "Feeding India Programme."
- B. Poshan: This vertical focuses on ensuring their financial security by employing a business model of healthy and affordable Tiffin Services operated by the residents living in the shelters of these NGOs.

3. Project Basera

Project Basera aims to provide employment opportunities to the women living in shelters to break free from the cycle of homelessness and vulnerability. This is ensured by turning them into entrepreneurs under our 2 tangents:

- A. Noor: The team collects PET plastic bottles discarded into the landfills to convert them into fabric, which is converted into apparel items like shirts, trousers, and scarves by the women of the homeless shelter.
- B. Rachna: The women convert the post-consumption fabric into multiple handicraft products like scrunchies, pouches, bags, etc.

Apart from the economic opportunities, as part of our commitment, we also impart free healthcare services for both physical and mental well-being with our partners such as Fortis Escorts.

By undertaking diverse projects, we acknowledge that each venture is guided by a unique vision and specific objectives, leading to distinct limitations and challenges. One of the pivotal hurdles encountered is the perception of customers and the prevailing lack of awareness among communities about these critical yet often overlooked issues. Need assessment surveys have unveiled a concerning indifference towards such pressing problems, necessitating a significant behavioural shift. Consequently, we place great emphasis on sensitizing communities to these challenges, making it a pivotal factor within the projects. By bringing these issues to light and generating a collective call for action, we aim to drive positive change and nurture a profound understanding of these socio-environmental needs.

Evidence of Success

The above projects have had an enormous impact in uplifting the communities and the solving of the grave problems they address. Through Project Kaagazi, we have recycled over 2.90 tons of paper waste, and expect to recycle up to 6.72 tons of paper waste by the end of 2023, thus preventing cutting down 144 trees and saving 20.31 gallons of water. By creating 24 Entrepreneurs and media imprints reaching over 5,400 people, we have sensitized 4,900+ people. In Project Kshitij, we have been able to increase the operational efficiency of our partner NGOs by 43%, while also improving education among children by 62%. By impacting 21,000+ people and catering to over 11,000 satisfied customers, we have created 35 entrepreneurs across 5 kitchens with a monthly income of Rs. 25,000. Through Project Basera, we have upcycled 48,809.5 kg of textile waste and recycled 40,846 kg of plastic, thus preventing 9,55,034 kg of carbon emissions as of May 2023. We have empowered 28 entrepreneurs in 4 shelters and created over 10 businesses. Our efforts have been featured in multiple leading publications like the Guardian and Medium and have been felicitated by the United Nations OHCHR.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required: Throughout our journey, every project undertaken has presented a diverse array of challenges spanning operations, sales management, marketing, sensitization, and project expansion. These obstacles have offered valuable lessons, which we have summarized as follows:

- 1. The team's background in management has at times posed technological drawbacks, potentially prolonging certain processes like product development. However, we have taken proactive steps to overcome these challenges through skill training sessions and seeking expert consultations.
- 2. Collaborations with external organizations for technical know-how and project expansion faced hindrances during the pandemic's onset, necessitating a blend of online communication in our operations. While normalcy is gradually being restored, the adopted hybrid approach now provides much improved operational efficiency.
- 3. Instigating behavioral change through sensitization has consistently been a primary challenge. Breaking stigmas and transforming lifestyles requires persistent effort, yet past successes demonstrate that such goals are achievable.

As of now, we believe that resources such as technical guidance, funding for the project, community support, and frequent mentorship sessions with experts would give an instant boostto running projects and enhance the knowledge and learning of team members through experiences of mentors.

Best Practice 2. Nurturing Job-Ready Undergraduate Talent

Objective: Fostering Capable Professionals by working on enhancing employability of undergraduate students to fulfill societal aspirations

Context: The batch has shown a strong inclination towards pursuing careers in the esteemed fields of Consulting and Investment Banking. Recognizing this trend, we proactively endeavored to attract a wider range of companies from these domains to our campus. In order to ensure a

smooth transition for the subsequent batch, we strategically prioritized internships that would significantly enhance students' chances of securing Pre-Placement Offers (PPOs), thereby minimizing any adverse impact on future placements.

Practice

Our relentless dedication to fostering strong industry connections and leveraging the valuable expertise of our accomplished alumni is evident in our ongoing efforts. We actively work towards enhancing the skill sets of our students through various programs and initiatives, including:

- 1. Prep-For-Success
 - The experienced third-year students from our college, who have already embarked on their professional journeys after securing placements, actively volunteer to mentor and provide guidance to the current students.
 - Data Points More than 222 students (2021-22) had been allotted mentors. 37 mentors were signed up.
- 2. Placement Preparation Sessions:
 - Students in their third year who secured positions at prestigious organizations conducted educational sessions for students preparing for the upcoming Placement Season, covering a wide range of topics.
 - Data Points More than 100 students participated

There has been session on soft skills, financial modelling, entrepreneurship, branding and innovation.

- 3. Care Programme:- The Care Programme, an alumni mentorship program, has achieved significant success in the past two years. In 2023 alone, we organized six engaging sessions involving senior alumni and first-year and second-year students, which received positive feedback. The Care Program focuses on developing skills such as resilience and assertiveness, providing a platform for deeper engagement and offering comprehensive guidance to students. This supportive relationship continues even after students graduate.
- 4. Industry Engagements
 - Company sessions conducted throughout the year (eg, EY, KPMG, Kearney)
 - Case study competitions conducted by Bain & Co. (BrAINWars) and EY (EY CAFTA)
- 5. Industrial Viva

Upon their return to campus following their summer internship assignment, students undergo two rounds of viva to evaluate their learning and overall performance. The initial round of viva involves faculty members who assess the quality of their reports and presentation skills. Based on the feedback received, the top 50 students proceed to the second round of viva, conducted by industry professionals. In 2022, the jury for the industry viva comprised the IMRB Research Head and an Assistant Manager from Invest India.

Extension and Outreach Activities

SSCBS stands by the motto "We rise by lifting others". The goal of all outreach activities undertaken at SSCBS is to identify major social problems affecting people's lives and take steps to overcome them. Various activities for the betterment and uplift of society are undertaken through the societies of the college.

Kartavya, the social service forum of SSCBS, along with NSS, conducts activities such as cleanliness drives, plantation drives, clothes donation drives, wishing wall (fulfilling the wishes of underprivileged children), bicycle rally, health checkup camp, blood donation camp, blood stem cell donation camp, awareness programmes, and informative webinars on important social issues like gender equality. During the COVID19 pandemic, NSS verified leads and took measures to spread awareness regarding necessary precautions. The society has undertaken many projects that tackle various social issues. Project Muskaan aims to educate society about the need to take every step to break stereotypes and work towards building a world where everyone is equal. It aims to develop a society devoid of stereotypes, miseries, and the old shackles of community and to develop a spirit of pluralism and brotherhood. It aims to raise individuals from the senses to consciousness. Project Chetna is an initiative to discuss mental health issues through various sessions and webinars and help people cope with them. Project Furry aims to promote animal welfare. The purpose of this initiative is to provide comfort, shelter, food, and nutrition to stray and unadopted animals. Project Saksham aims to promote awareness about education, careers, skills, and government sponsorships and policies, among others by providing support to individuals of all ages, from children to young adults and beyond, to unlock their potential for a brighter future. Project Samman aims to raise awareness about the needs of the elderly and encourage students to give back to their community. Under the project, we recently collected more than 230 KG of food items and donated them to Davo - an old age home, which helped improve the lives of the elderly residents of the old age home. Under Project Kilkari, we recently collaborated with Scope for Change, which is a non-profit NGO that works for social causes such as women empowerment, health, environment and education. Under the collaboration, every Saturday 4-5 members of our society visit the NGO and take classes of NGO children. Till now, we have done 17 visits and have covered various topics such as basic grammar, basic mathematics, basic finance, leadership and teamwork skills, MS Excel, MS PowerPoint, Canva, creative art, etc.

Enactus at Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies (SSCBS) was founded in January 2009 with the aim of social entrepreneurship. Enactus SSCBS has successfully implemented 11 projects which continue to impact more than 8.6 lakh people while achieving the 17 Sustainable Development Goals of the UN. The team is dedicated towards improving the economy, society, and environment and thus believes in becoming the change that the world needs. Project Pravaah, an endeavor to curb indoor air pollution while reducing the harmful effects of stubble burning and Project Basera, aimed at inculcating financial and social self-sufficiency among the women in homeless shelters in Delhi. Project Basera provides employment opportunities to homeless women living in shelters. Its business segment, Noor, addresses the issue of PET waste by recycling it into the fabric, which women entrepreneurs then turn into apparel. Another business segment, "Rachna," deals with the problem of textile waste by upcycling it into hand-crafted goods like scrunchies. Health camps were organized to extend free medical care to women and children. Counseling sessions were provided to address mental health issues. Project Kshitij intends to restructure NGOs to build self-sufficient organizations and increase their effectiveness. Under tangent Saarthi, the core objective is to implement the educational modules designed with the guidance of experts, developing infrastructure and training staff. A critical analysis was conducted for Kamakhya NGO. To combat malnutrition among children in NGOs, we partnered with Zomato to provide them with nutritious meals. For revenue generation and to empower self-help groups, a tiffin service model was established under tangent Poshan which provides out-of-state workers and college students affordable home-cooked meals. Project Kaagazi aims to manage paper waste generation by adopting a three-fold waste collection system which includes partnering with organizations to assess their waste generation level and existing management system. Then the paper waste is collected on two levels: administrative level through direct collection and at the individual level through custom-designed paper bins. This is then recycled into notebooks, pencils, photo frames, and lamps by our entrepreneurs who live in Kathputli Colony, a slum lacking basic facilities. The training of the entrepreneurs is currently underway with Prerna NGO, along with personal development workshops on bookkeeping, computer literacy, and healthy lifestyle choices.

Rotaract SSCBS is a service chapter of Rotary International. Rotary International comprises 1.2 million leaders, working towards lasting global, community, and personal change. Rotaract SSCBS has two ongoing long-term projects. Project Kamakhya aims to replace menstrual products with an eco-friendly solution, impacting 200 children and 100+ women through sensitisation sessions and pad donation drives. They surveyed slums, identified raw materials, and created a biodegradable pad prototype with an aim to reduce menstrual waste by 1 lakh tonnes and promote healthy practices. Project Srijan bridges the gap between informal and formal e-waste recycling sectors. After channelising around 6.8 tonnes of e-waste from various schools, colleges and RWAs into the formal sector, Srijan has prevented more than 4500 kg of CO2 and 22 kg of methane emissions from being released. The General Research department of Rotaract SSCBS identifies various societal problems and develops innovative and feasible solutions constantly. Rotaract SSCBS also has a charitable wing, which organises several short-term activities, including blood and book donation drives benefiting 100+ people and 50+ children. They conducted period pain simulator activity with participation from over 200 people, food donation drives impacting 70+ families, and distributed wheat straws as a replacement for plastic straws. They also organised a food donation drive for dogs, an open mic event, cloth and sanitary kit donation drives, and distributed stationery sets. Rotaract SSCBS has also received mentions in

Dainik Jagran, Punjab Kesri, Nav Bharat Times, NDTV and Apna Radio- 96.9 FM radio channel. Rotaract SSCBS strives to make a sustainable impact in communities.

CDF SSCBS undertook a student-led social entrepreneurship initiative, Project Hunar, as part of the Connecting Dreams Foundation aimed at upskilling (thereby financially uplifting) women and children by providing vocational training and teaching them how to make eco-friendly products that also add economic value to the society. The society has an ongoing project, Project Utsav, where we work with the potter's community by directly connecting them with the restaurants and cafes and thus eliminate the middlemen ensuring all the revenue and profit generated goes to the potters.

North East Committee

North east committee organised events, workshops, and discussions to provide opportunities for members to engage with and learn from each other, as well as to share their own cultural experiences.

Movie Screening: The first event after the formation of The NE cell was a movie screening on 12th April 2023, where 2 short movies from Northeast India were showcased. This movie screening, aimed to encourage a cultural exchange of ideas and spark positive dialogue about Northeast India amongst our own circles.

818 Fest: The first annual Northeast Fest '818' was organised with Crescendo on 18th and 19th April 2023. It hosted stage performances inviting participants from various other Northeast Cells of Delhi University, where they performed their traditional dances and songs. It also ran a stall during the event and sold a wide array of traditional jewellery, various indigenous dishes, and NE souvenirs like stickers and bags.

Annexure 28: Enactus

Established in January 2009, Enactus at Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies (SSCBS) was started to reach out to individuals in need, based on principles of entrepreneurship and philanthropy. Following the 17 Sustainable Goals of the UN, we have successfully run 11 projects and impacted more than 8.6 Lakh lives. With a three-fold objective of economic, social, and environmental betterment, the team believes in becoming the change that world needs. Enactus SSCBS has received grants from Dell, Ford Motors, KPMG, Coca-Cola, etc. It won the Enactus World Cup 2017 for Project Raahat which got appreciation from the former president, Shri Ram Nath Kovind. Project Basera was under the Top 4 out of 180+ Enactus projects across 120 Enactus teams at the Enactus India Nationals 2022.

Summary of work done throughout the year 2022-23


Project Basera, launched in 2020, aims to tackle the problem homelessness by providing employment opportunities to the homeless individuals. Its business segment, Noor, aims to tackle the problem of PET waste, by converting it into fabric. This fabric is further provided to the women entrepreneurs, who reside at the Rain Basera shelter, they make apparel like shirts and trousers from this fabric. Second business segment "Rachna" intends to tackle the problem of textile waste, this waste is recycled into hand-crafted goods like wall hangings, cushions, belts, scrunchies, etc.

by our women entrepreneurs. To enhance the sewing and machine operating skills of the women entrepreneurs, we organized training sessions. To train them in business acumen, bookkeeping, and financial literacy sessions were conducted. Health camps were also organized for the women. Along with this, sensitization sessions were also conducted on mental health problems. A circular economy model is established by utilizing the textile waste from Noor's operations in the creation of handcrafted goods in Rachna.

Project Kshitij aims to restructure NGOs to build self-sufficient organizations and increase their effectiveness. The project primarily focuses on implementing educational curriculum designed in association with professionals to provide quality education to the children associated with them. It also emphasizes the infrastructural development of the NGOs. In order to increase the efficiency of the staff at NGOs, training sessions on skills enhancement are conducted. Pediatric healthcare facilities are provided for children to ensure their well-being. Apart from this, sensitization sessions on topics like sanitation and healthy practices were organized. For revenue generation and to empower self-help groups and marginalized people, a tiffin service model was established, which provided employment opportunities to them. This model delivers homemade food at reasonable prices to college-going students and out state workers.

Project Kaagazi, initiated in 2023, intends to reduce the paper waste generated. Paper waste is segregated into recyclable and non-recyclable. The recyclable paper waste is transformed into stationery items like notebooks and pens. The research to find a solution to recycle the non-recyclable paper waste led us to the marginalized people of Kathputli Colony. The people are currently being trained in the basic skills of paper design. The non-recyclable paper waste will be creatively transformed into photo frames, flowers, and lamps. They will also be designing the covers for notebooks. They are also learning microfinance management, healthy practices, cover design, and much more.

- SPEAKER SESSION A session on mental and menstrual health of women was organised in which the speaker was Niharika Sharma, an International Development Professional working with communities and young adults on solutions regarding mental and menstrual health.
- PRIDE MONTH A pride parade and movie screening were organised to celebrate pride month and promote social inclusivity, gender equality and queer rights.

PROJECT CHETNA

During the COVID-19 pandemic, it was seen that the mental health of people was deteriorating very much. And to address this grave situation, Kartavya launched Project Chetna, an initiative to discuss mental health issues and help people cope with them. Following were the parts of Project Chetna:-

- WE STAND AGAINST TROLLING was started, in which social media influencers and enthusiasts shared their personal experiences on how they deal with derogatory comments and trolls. We were delighted to have speakers like Charvi Jain (psychologist, psychotherapist and entrepreneur) and Niharika Srivastava (Counselling Psychologist with 3+ years of experience).
- YOU ARE NOT ALONE It is seen that people having mental health issues often feel that they are alone, and nobody would understand their situation. However, that is not the truth, and so Kartavya came up with a series called "You Are Not Alone", wherein we shared success stories against mental illness of famous celebrities. We covered stories of Deepika Padukone, Varun Dhawan, Lady Gaga and many others.

• WEBINARS - Various webinars were also conducted under Project Chetna, where psychologists addressed topics related to mental health and brought awareness among students. We were delighted to have renowned personalities like Dakshiani Bhan (mental health professional), Anuradha Seth (director of Good Mental Health RCI), Himani Kulkarni (Founder of Chaubara: A mental health India) and Niharika Srivastava (International Development Professional) on board for the speaker sessions.

PROJECT FURRY

Last year during Vivante'23, Kartavya launched its new project, i.e., Project Furry to promote animal welfare. The purpose of this initiative is to provide comfort, shelter, food and nutrition to stray and unadopted animals. Till now, the following activities have taken place under the project:-

Events Organised:

Queer Straight Alliance of SSCBS organised its annual pride event, IRIS'22. The event had the following activities:

1. Pehchaan

An Open Mic segment organized collectively by QSA and Litsoc of SSCBS. Renowned guests like Hiten Noonwal, Dr. Abhishek Royal and Shabnam Bewafa from the queer community were invited. Performers from the DU circuit among many colleges and even the Queer Cells throughout Delhi University joined this Open Mic.

The footfall for our Open Mic was over 65+ students. The number of participants in the event were 34.

2. Movie Screening

The Team also held a Movie Screening in our college auditorium. The movies screened included Aligarh and 2 other award-winning short films - "Mother-in-law" and "In a Heartbeat," based on

Rotaract SSCBS undertook various activities across a multitude of domains targeting social impact as well as substantial environmental change. The sessions held were the following:

- 1. Rotaract SSCBS conducted an online awareness session on exploring the potential of Green Entrepreneurship in Rural India with Anurag Trivedi, the esteemed founder of Shaan Academy, a teacher, and a dedicated social worker.
- 2. Driven by its commitment to disease prevention and treatment, the club organized a highly informative webinar on the prevention of kidney stones.
- 3. Rotaract SSCBS organized two engaging and informative sessions-one on Crypto

Trading and the other on Canva workshop— aiming to equip participants with valuable knowledge and skills.

4. Various other sessions were organized throughout the year, focusing on various areas including professional development, skill development, community building, increasing awareness among the masses, etc.

Other Initiatives:

- 1. Blood Donation Camp: A blood donation camp was set up at Khan Market's Lok Nayak Bhawan in New Delhi by Rac SSCBS. The drive took place from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., with a footfall of over 100+ people. A mobile blood collection van was provided by the Rotary Club of Faridabad Midtown. The team successfully collected 12 units of blood.
- 2. Book Donation Drive: Rotaract SSCBS, in collaboration with Nanhe Pakshi NGO, organized a highly successful book donation drive aimed at fostering literacy and offering educational materials to underprivileged children. The enthusiastic response from donors resulted in over 100+ books covering a diverse range of subjects. The collected books were meticulously sorted, categorized, and subsequently distributed to a free-access library established by Nanhe Pakshi NGO in slums near Netaji Subhash Place, Delhi. This heartwarming initiative elicited immense joy and heartfelt gratitude among the young recipients.
- 3. Sanitary Pad Donation Drive: Rotaract SSCBS organized a pad donation drive in collaboration with Nanhe Pakshi NGO in slum dwellings located near Netaji Subhash Place, Delhi. As part of this initiative, 50+ free pad distributions were facilitated through a contractual agreement with Connecting Dreams Foundation SRCC. Educational sessions on menstruation were also conducted, promoting discussion on the socially taboo topic and raising awareness about its significance among slum women. This effort directly benefited 50+ women and indirectly impacted over 150+ women.
- 4. Project Muskaan: A dynamic interactive session for kids aged 7-15 aiming at youth empowerment was organized by Rotaract SSCBS in collaboration with Shubhakshika Educational Society, catalysing the personal growth of over 100 children by providing them with a safe and encouraging space to learn, express, and articulate their ideas effectively, fostering creativity, knowledge expansion, eloquence, and logical and critical thinking.
- 5. Period Pain Stimulator: In collaboration with Samvedna The Gender Sensitization Forum of Sri Aurobindo College, the team organized a period pain simulator event, which witnessed participation from over 200 individuals. The event witnessed high enthusiasm and zeal from the participants. It was found that a majority of individuals described period cramps as extremely painful and unbearable. The event was a tribute to women.
- 6. Project Kanak: Project Kanak aimed to promote sustainable alternatives to plastic straws by advocating for the use of wheat straws in the food and beverage industry. The project team collaborated with local farmers to procure wheat stems, which were skilfully transformed into 1000+ eco-friendly straws. Samples of these straws were distributed to juice shops in Rohini, Delhi, raising awareness about the harmful effects of plastic pollution. The project successfully initiated a shift towards sustainable alternatives and promoted environmental consciousness.
- 7. Project Nawazish: Zone 2 of Rotary International District 3012, in collaboration with Project Zero Hunger and the Jan Mangal Arth Prabandhan Foundation, organized "NAWAZISH" at "Apna Ghar Old Age Home". As part of the event, 68 kgs of ration were donated to the old age home, and a variety of fun-based activities were held to engage with the residents of the home.

- 8. Project Darpan: Rac SSCBS conducted a food donation drive in a slum area along with engagement activities with slum children. More than 35 families benefited from the drive. Fruitful interactions with kids were conducted through interactive and stimulative activities like puzzles and other games. Personal interaction with slum dwellers further assisted the team in gaining insights into the other problems faced by these families.
- 9. Project Ikshana: A food donation drive for dogs was initiated by Rotaract SSCBS, aiming to provide sustenance to street animals, directly impacting over 50+ dogs in the vicinity of Rohini, Delhi. The project aimed at well-being and stopping ill-treatment of street dogs. The team attempted to resolve apprehensions and promote awareness of the need for protection for vulnerable street dogs.
- 10. Project Voice: This project, an initiative by the Rotaract Club of Delhi Pegasus under Zone-2, aimed to raise awareness against social injustices by actively promoting inclusivity and love. Celebrated and supported by Rotaract SSCBS, this endeavour sought to challenge stereotypes associated with gender, disability, and any form of discrimination. The zonal project, with active participation and volunteering of members from Rotaract SSCBS at the open mic event organized by Voice at Nehru Park, Delhi, initiated discourse on important social issues impacting over 150+ people and helped provide a platform for people to advocate for positive change.
- 11. Clothes Donation Drive: A successful clothes donation drive was organized both within the SSCBS campus and throughout the district. The initiative witnessed substantial participation from club members, campus faculty, and students, along with contributions from other collaborating clubs, ensuring its successful completion. The clothes collected were directly donated to Goonj NGO, positively impacting over 100+ people.
- 12. Project Shudh: This project, jointly initiated by the Rotaract Club of Delhi Pegasus and the Rotaract Club of Physiotherapy Scholars, aimed to address the lack of access to sanitary and hygiene items in underprivileged communities. This collaborative effort focused on raising awareness about maternal and child healthcare while promoting overall well-being. To tackle this challenge, the project expanded to include the distribution of essential sanitary kits, thereby making a positive impact and improving health conditions in needy communities.
- **13.** Project Vivek: Project Vivek aimed to support underprivileged children in slums by providing essential educational materials and guidance. Emphasizing the importance of education, the project distributed essential stationery sets and invested in teaching fundamental and basic skills like writing. Over 50+ children directly benefited from this initiative, experiencing a transformative shift in their perspective toward education and gaining renewed motivation to pursue their studies. The project instilled hope and motivation, empowering these young minds to break the cycle of poverty and aspire for a brighter future.
- 14. Project Nirvah: Project Nirvah aims at eradicating hunger, which is one of the major issues our nation- India is facing. The aim is to make good-quality food grains more accessible to the needy and poor at the cheapest rates. With the aim of combating hunger by bridging the gap between impoverished people and wilful donors to uplift the destitute by providing them with quality grains at a fraction of the market price. The grains would be raw and packaged for the convenience of the consumer. The consumers would encompass below-poverty-line people living in slums. The supply chain would be managed by Rotaract through an offline direct-to-consumer model.
- 15. Project Kamakhya: Project Kamakhya is pioneering efforts to break menstrual taboos and encourage menstrual hygiene for all women. It aims to educate marginalized women on menstrual hygiene and the environmental impact of menstrual waste. Project Kamakhya

sensitizes and educates women to handle their periods with pride. Eliminating period myths protects young girls' self-esteem and provides a safe, supportive menstrual environment. Raw materials were selected, and the Madrasi slum was surveyed to determine pad preferences and prices after assessing money. The team developed a deck to educate youngsters about menstruation while also working towards Business Plans to demonstrate the project's potential and sustainability.

- 16. Project Srijan: The urgent need to address the environmental and social implications of e-waste mismanagement and disposal led to Project Srijan. Project Srijan connects the undiscovered formal sector, the disadvantaged informal sector, and the uninformed public to offer non-bulk e-waste creators' disposal options. Project Srijan exchanges waste and information commercially. The team collaborated with schools, college clubs, RWAs, and other Rotaract clubs and collected about 80 kgs of e-waste and conducted sensitization sessions to educate the masses about the same.
- 17. Project Uphaar: Rotaract SSCBS collaborated with the Rotaract Club of DTU Regency in its flagship event, The Diwali Mela—UPHAAR. It involved Diwali puja, shopping stalls with special handmade decorative items, rangoli making, diya decoration contests, etc. at the event. The club held Rotaract Club Mixer events with the following, giving it a chance to meet new people, broaden its scope and network:

Annexure 48: Sadhana: The Yoga Society of SSCBS



Number of sessions/webinars/workshops organized by the society: 8

1. Session on Mental health: July 11, 2022

An interactive session on mental health and related issues titled 'Mental Health, Issues and Services' was conducted by Ms. Radhika Shroff, a qualified psychologist. She spoke about various mental health issues, lack of awareness about them and the associated social stigma. She also brought into limelight various myths associated with mental health issues and conveyed the importance of addressing such issues timely. A total of 8 students voluntarily attended the talk. The participants found the talk very engaging. There was active participation from the students, who discussed several issues they were facing being away from home (non-Delhiites).

2,3. Breath-Works Workshop: September 19,23,28, 2022 & December 7,14, 2022

Two workshops on right breathing techniques were conducted by Dr. Ashok Bhatt during the year – one of which was conducted over three days (2 hrs each day) and one over two days (2 hrd each day). Dr. Bhatt discussed the benefits of right breathing (particularly abdominal breathing), and explained how this simple technique may be instrumental in combating stress and anxiety. Fifteen participants (including students, 3 teachers, 2 non-teaching staff members) benefited from the first workshop. Thirty five students (from VAC on Yoga, and others) along with 3 teachers benefited from the second workshop.

4. Session on Mental Health and related issues - November 21, 2022

A talk on Mental Health and Related Issues was organized for the first-year students. The goal was to make the students aware about common mental issues, and make them understand the importance of talking about such issues and seeking help at the right time. The speaker for the session was psychologist Ms. Radhika Shroff. Students from first year across all courses attended the session.

5. Session on Mental Health and Deaddiction - June 12, 2023

As a part of the celebrations of the 9th International Day of Yoga 2023, a 2-hour interactive session on Mental Health and Deaddiction by a team of three psychiatrists from AIIMS Delhi was conducted on June 12, 2023. The doctors started with brief introductions about the subjects for about 45 minutes. They talked about the importance of timely identifying, acknowledging and addressing mental health issues. Also, they mentioned symptoms that indicate the need for professional intervention. The panelists threw light on what can and what cannot be classified as "addiction", the hazards of substance abuse and how to avoid falling prey to it. This followed a question-answer round wherein students raised various questions about the common issues that today's youth face, such as stress, anxiety, addiction, relationship issues etc. The discussion was highly appreciated by the students and many of them benefitted. About 315 students from first year across all courses attended the session.

6. Workshop on Pranayama - Why Should I Change The Way I Breathe held on June 15, 2023

As a part of the celebrations of the 9th International Day of Yoga 2023, a 2-hour workshop on the do's and don'ts of Pranayama practice was held on June 15, 2023. The title of the workshop was 'Why Should I Change the Way I Breathe'. Dr. Sumitra A. Bentur, an Ayurveda physician and Yoga

therapist with more than 20 years of experience, was the resource person for the workshop. The workshop was divided into 2 segments with the first segment being dedicated to theoretical concepts and the second being a practice session. Dr. Bentur explained the yogic perspective of the human body comprising 5 sheaths called the *Panchaprana*, explained the significance of *Prana*, and the pitfalls of the *Pranayama* practice. Many pranayamas were practised by the participants during the practical session, as the resource person pointed out the do's and dont's. The workshop was highly appreciated by all the participants. A total of 12 participants attended the workshop including 9 students, 2 teachers and 1 participant from outside SSCBS.

7. Guided Yogasana Session: June 21, 2023

A guided Yogasana session was conducted by three experts from Bhartiya Yog Sansthan in the college grounds on June 21, 2023 from 7 am to 8 am. The experts started by educating the participants about benefits of adopting Yoga in lifestyle. They also described simple practices that can be done to counter the effects of long sitting hours and screen time. This was followed by practice of *yogasanas*. The session concluded with everyone enjoying fresh coconut water. The session was appreciated by the students. Twenty students from SSCBS and 9 children from Shubhakshika Educational Society (an NGO that operates in Rohini, Delhi) attended the session.

8. Experiential Session by a team from Sahaja Yoga: June 21, 2023

A team from Sahaja Yoga put up a kiosk in the college premises to help the interested experience the benefits of meditation. Many interested students and staff members benefited from the live experience.

Other initiatives

1. Meditation Session: December - 20,21(2022) & March - 20,21,22,27,28(2023)

Under the Har Ghar Dhyan program, a team from The Art of Living organized one-hour meditation sessions for the students of first, second and third years (all courses).

2. Visit to the Aurobindo Ashram, Delhi branch: January 18, 2023

A visit to the Aurobindo Ashram was organized for the students pursuing VAC on Yoga: Philosophy and Practice, and the students of the Sadhana society. The program began at 2 pm with a discussion on The Journey of Life, which was followed by a demonstration of some asanas and pranayama by a volunteer from the Ashram. At the end, the students were given a tour of the Ashram and were served tea and snacks. Forty eight students joined the trip.


