1. Name of the society: Enactus SSCBS

2. Information about the society in brief (3-4 lines):

Established in January 2009, Enactus at Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies (SSCBS) was started to reach out to individuals in need, based on principles of entrepreneurship and philanthropy. Following the 17 Sustainable Goals of the UN, we have successfully run 11 projects and impacted more than 8.6 Lakh lives. With a three-fold objective of economic, social, and environmental betterment, the team believes in becoming the change that world needs. Enactus SSCBS has received grants from Dell, Ford Motors, KPMG, Coca-Cola, etc. It won the Enactus World Cup 2017 for Project Raahat which got appreciation from the former president, Shri Ram Nath Kovind. Project Basera was in Top 4 out of 180+ Enactus projects across 120 Enactus teams at the Enactus India Nationals 2022.

3. Summary of work done throughout the year 2023-24

Project Basera, launched in 2020, aims to tackle the problem homelessness by providing employment opportunities to the homeless individuals. Its business segment, Noor, aims to tackle the problem of PET waste, by converting it into fabric. This fabric is further provided to the women entrepreneurs, who reside at the Rain Basera shelter, they make apparel like shirts and trousers from this fabric. Second business segment "Rachna" intends to tackle the problem of textile waste, this waste is recycled into hand-crafted goods like wall hangings, cushions, belts, scrunchies, etc. by our women entrepreneurs. To enhance the sewing and machine operating skills of the women entrepreneurs, we organized training sessions. To train them in business acumen, bookkeeping, and financial literacy various sessions were conducted. Health camps were also organized for the women. Along with this, sensitization sessions were also conducted on mental health problems. A circular economy model is established by utilizing the textile waste from Noor's operations in the creation of handcrafted goods in Rachna.

Project Kshitij aims to restructure NGOs to build self-sufficient organizations and increase their effectiveness. The project primarily focuses on implementing educational curriculum designed in association with professionals to provide quality education to the children associated with them. It also emphasizes the infrastructural development of the NGOs. In order to increase the efficiency of the staff at NGOs, training sessions on skills enhancement are conducted. Pediatric healthcare facilities are provided for children to ensure their well-being. Apart from this, sensitization sessions on topics like sanitation and healthy practices were organized. For revenue generation and to empower self-help groups and marginalized people, a tiffin service model was established, which provided employment opportunities to them. This model delivers homemade food at reasonable prices to college-going students and out state workers.

Project Kaagazi, initiated in 2023, intends to reduce the paper waste generated. Paper waste is segregated into recyclable and non-recyclable. The recyclable paper waste is transformed into stationery items like notebooks and pens. The research to find a solution to recycle the non-recyclable paper waste led us to the marginalized people of Kathputli Colony. The people are currently being trained in the basic skills of paper design. The non-recyclable paper waste will be creatively transformed into photo frames,

flowers, and lamps. They will also be designing the covers for notebooks. They are also learning microfinance management, healthy practices, cover design, and much more.
