Brief Write up of the Seminars/Workshops
<p><b>Web3 and BlockChain 101</b> : Kronos in collaboration with ‘Router Protocol’ and ‘soonami.io’ hosted an informative workshop on basics of web 3 development along with building and deploying decentralized applications (dApps) on any blockchain. This session was led by Muskan Jain (Business Development Manager at soonami.io) and Shivank Kapur (Developers Relations Intern at Router Protocol).</p> <p><b>Web3 Workshop</b> : This Workshop was conducted in collaboration with ‘TON Blockchain’ and ‘HackQuest’ to impart knowledge about mini-apps deployment for grabbing market quickly and at a much reduced cost. This Workshop was led by Shyaamal Tripathi (Community manager at TON, HackQuest). The session provided key insights about creating and launching mini Apps on Telegram to <b>100+</b> students.</p> <p>We also organized <b>Orkes Workshop</b> where the speaker Atlaf Alam Ansari (Software Developer at Orkes) taught all the participants about how orkes is used to simplify the creation, execution, and scaling of distributed business flows. It seamlessly integrates internal and external microservices, workflows, and events. Also how Developers and enterprises can build and scale complex applications with high observability, security, and durability using Orkes.</p> <p><b>OpenGig Workshop</b>: The Workshop was conducted in collaboration with ‘OpenGig’ and ‘Athenasquare’ which was led by Aman Arora and Ayush Kumar. This workshop covered how students can apply their theoretical knowledge into practical projects that too with earning gigs. This insightful workshop was pushed community led initiatives.</p>

<b>Brief Write up of the Fest organized</b>
<p>Our annual event <b>hackCBS</b>, i.e. India’s largest student-run hackathon, hosts a number of keynote sessions being taken by working professionals of prominent companies including Google, Microsoft, MLH, Permissionless, Elastic, Orkes, Hack2Skill and Ton. The event fostered creativity, technical skills, and teamwork, culminating in groundbreaking solutions in various domains. We host eminent industry professionals across the globe. hackCBS, being India’s largest student run hackathon, witnessed extensive growth over the years. Kronos organized the 6th edition back in its offline mode, which witnessed a registration of over 3500+ students and experienced a footfall of 500+ participants. The hackathon was organized on 4th-5th November in the college premises with a prize pool of 150,000\$.</p> <p>It was conducted with the following timeline :</p> <p>Workshops and sessions → Mentorship sessions for students → Building applications and submissions → Prize Distribution</p> <p>Dynamic workshops sponsored by Ton, Orkes, and GitHub brought together professionals to engage with participants. The hackathon featured mentorship sessions in technical skills, product design, and career development, fostering a collaborative environment. Teams had 36 hours to build applications on themes like FinTech, EdTech, and Web 3, submitting projects through Devfolio. Prizes were awarded for innovation and technical execution, with categories including Best Hack Blockchain and Best Hack Beginner.</p>

## 7. Other Initiatives

- **Let’s Game: Experience the Virtual Reality :**

A workshop organized by Kronos in collaboration with techXR on September 5th, 2023, introduced 140 first-year students to the captivating world of virtual reality (VR). Through immersive experiences and interactive sessions, students gained hands-on familiarity with VR technology.

- **Nerf-War :**

A Super fun activity where epic battles were fought with foam darts and blasters. Picture a chaotic playground, friends ducking behind couches, and laughter echoing through the air. This event was organized on 30th April & 1st May in which 240+ students participated and it generated a revenue of more than 16000 Rs.

- **Laser-Tag :**

An electrifying game where players wield infrared guns and battle it out in futuristic arenas. Neon lights, heart-pounding music, and adrenaline-fueled pursuits, this event was like stepping into a sci-fi movie, dodging invisible beams and claiming victory. This event organized on 30th April and 1st May hosted over 170 students with Rs. 15000+ in revenue.

- **Zorbing :**

An adventurous game where you roll down inside a giant transparent ball. This event filled with laughter as gravity takes you on a wild ride was organized on 30th April and 1st May witnessed participation of 150+ students and generated revenue of more than Rs. 12000.
