Our Chief Guest

Shri Anil Agrawal, an IPS officer of the 1988 batch is currently a Member of the Competition Commission of India. He superannuated in April 2023 as Director General of Police from Uttar Pradesh cadre.

He has served as the Additional Secretary to the Govt of India at Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, where he handled some of the flagship schemes of Govt of India including Make in India, Investment Promotion, Startup India, e-commerce, Internal Trade, production linked incentive (PLI) schemes, technical regulations, several industrial sectors like consumer and light engineering industries including toys, white goods, leather, cement and paper; and international cooperation with select

geographies.

He has steered the flagship **Startup India** program from its infancy to give it a firm institutional framework and contributed significantly to the drafting of **National e-Commerce Policy and Production Linked Incentive Scheme for White Goods** (Air Conditioners and LED Lights).

Previously, at UP Police, he conceptualized and commissioned world's largest emergency response system- UP100 (now UP 112) for providing prompt emergency services to 250 million citizens anytime, anywhere in the State of UP. This implementation has been recognized amongst top innovations in the country during Civil Services Day 2018: PM Awards for Excellence in Public Administration and Innovations.

He is an awardee of the **President's Police Medal for Distinguished Service** and **Police Medal for Meritorious Service** apart from many other commendations. He has been conferred the **BITS Pilani Distinguished Service Award in 2023.**

Message from the Principal

I am honored to present the 37th Annual Report of our college, a testimony to another remarkable year of achievements and growth.

Having started our journey as the first college in the University of Delhi to offer a degree programme in Business Studies, now named Bachelor of Management Studies, we have come a long way, overcoming challenges, learning with new experiences, and creating history. Our mantra - perseverance, and commitment to quality – has brought us laurels, and we are recognized as the best undergraduate college by India Today yet again in June 2024, making it 5 times in a row. The College is graded 'A+' by the National Accreditation Assessment Council. Today, SSCBS offers, three professional undergraduate (honors) programs, namely Bachelor of Management Studies, Bachelor of



Business Administration (Financial Investment Analysis), and Bachelor of Science in Computer Science, a postgraduate programme in Cyber Security and Law, and other certification courses namely Data Analytics and Business Intelligence, Digital Marketing, Financial Modeling and Algo Trading, NSE Academy Certified Capital Market Professional, and Applied FinTech.

The placement cell of the college is dedicated to getting the best job opportunities for the students. We also have a government-supported incubation center to extend infrastructure and seed funding to innovative new ideas. On the placements front, this year, we witnessed an influx of reputed companies, leading to successful student placements. We focused on bringing firms for diverse roles including consulting, private equity, investment banking, FMCG, venture capitalist, data analytics, and trading. 81 companies visited the campus this year, making 235 offers with the highest CTC offer of an impressive 28 LPA and the average CTC stood at 10.88 LPA. We are proud to have prominent recruiters like Boston Consulting Group, AB InBev, Bain Capability Network, D.E Shaw Group, LEK, McKinsey Knowledge Centre, Wells Fargo, Xander, and Alvarez and Marsal, reflecting the recognition and value of our institution. 51 students received offers for higher education from prestigious institutions after successfully passing highly competitive exams like the CAT. We focus on getting quality summer internships for students. Dalberg offered the highest stipend at 95K per month. McKinsey and AB InBev provided 75K, and Nation with NaMo provided 50K per month.

Our students have been winning accolades at both global and national levels. This year, our students secured podium finishes at prestigious international and national level case competitions while competing against some of the world's best universities, including Harvard, MIT, Stanford, NUS, and Hong Kong University. A few to mention are the Global Microfinance Case Competition by The Melbourne Microfinance Initiative; the HSBC/HKU Global Case Competition by HSBC; and National Winners at BRAINWARS by Bain and Co. One of our students received an 80,000 JPY scholarship at the Global

Entrepreneurship Mindset Programme – of Kansai University of International Studies, Kobe Japan.

Besides instilling leadership and entrepreneurial skills in our students, we nurture them into responsible citizens and compassionate humans. Many student societies are engaged in outreach and extension activities wherein they identify and contribute to alleviating social and environmental problems. We also care for our student's overall well-being and empathize with the youth who have been impacted socially, emotionally, and mentally. Resonating with the need of the hour, we have appointed a counselor, a practicing clinical psychologist, to care for the emotional and psychological aspects of our students' health.

Looking ahead, we remain committed to our mission of providing quality education and fostering an environment where creativity and collaboration thrive.

Shaheed Sukhdev Thapar

Freedom Fighter (15th May 1907 - 23rd March 1931)



Biography

Sukhdev Thapar was an Indian freedom fighter. Born in Ludhiana Sukhdev, since his childhood, was a witness to several atrocities that the Imperial British Raj had inflicted on India, which led him to become a freedom fighter. Sukhdev, along with other renowned freedom fighters, started the Naujawan Bharat Sabha gearing the youth to join the freedom struggle. He is best remembered for his involvement in the Lahore Conspiracy Case (18th December 1928) and its aftermath that shook the foundation of the British Government. After the Central Assembly Hall bombings in Delhi (8th April 1929) Sukhdev and his associates were arrested and hanged on 23rd March 1931. Sukhdev Thapar became a martyr at a young age of 24 years to pay homage and tribute to the three brave freedom fighters namely, Shri Sukhdev Thapar, Shri Shivram Rajguru and Shri Bhagat Singh, the National Social Scheme of Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies celebrated Shaheed Diwas on 23rd March, 2022

When someone sacrifices themselves for their nation, they always leave behind an unforgettable legacy. Commemorating the courage and indelible impression of the three heroes, every year 23rd March is observed as Shaheed Diwas.

About the College

Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies (SSCBS) is one of the premier institutions of the University of Delhi, imparting path-breaking education in the fields of Management and Information Technology. It was established in August 1987 by the Government of the National Capital Territory of Delhi (GNCTD) on the initiation of University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Ministry of Human Resources and Development, Government of India (MHRD).

At present, the college offers three full-time graduate programs under its three departments - Departments of Management Studies (DMS) and Department of Computer Science (DCS) leading to the award of Bachelor of Management Studies, Bachelor of Business Administration (Financial Investment Analysis) and B.Sc. (H) Computer Science.

The college also offers a post graduate diploma course in Cyber Security and Law. The college emphasizes an interactive mode of education, supported with innovative teaching methodologies. It is designed to stimulate inquiring minds and provide significant exposure to the realities of business processes and challenges. Industry interaction is achieved through guest lectures, industrial tours, industry-based project work, live projects, internships and summer training. The strength of the college lies in its highly qualified faculty having industrial experience, dynamic students, supportive non-teaching staff, illustrious alumni and a supportive and encouraging governing body.

The college supports about 45 student societies working in diverse areas including strengthening students' skills in various domains (such as marketing, finance, technology and entrepreneurship), social outreach, mental and emotional health, environment etc.

The high standards of excellence give SSCBS the phenomenal and undeniable edge we are recognized for. These standards are endlessly pushed beyond the horizon. At SSCBS, we are never content. The inverse correlation between our satisfaction and our progress is an acknowledged and appointed theory at SSCBS. This is the SSCBS difference.

What sets SSCBS apart from other colleges is our recognition that every student is different. We strive to identify and maintain that 'difference'. Programs

Bachelor of Management Studies

Head of the Department: Dr Nidhi Kesari

Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS) is an under-graduate programme imparting education in management. The duration of the course is three years. Under New Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the students will have the flexibility of completing the course in four years as well. The course was originally known as Bachelor of Business Studies (BBS), when it was first introduced by University of Delhi in 1987. The course allows students to obtain the knowledge and skills needed to assume management positions in a wide range of organizations. Students are also motivated to go for summer internships to gain practical insight from industry which makes their course content more meaningful.

Bachelor of Science (H) Computer Science

Head of the Department: Dr. Shikha Gupta

The computer science department at Shaheed Sukhdev college of Business Studies has the objective of imparting quality education in the field of Computer Science. With the rapidly evolving technology and the continuous need for innovation, the college offers modern facilities for teaching, learning and research. The B.Sc. (H) Computer Science programme is designed to develop analytical & computational thinking, and problem-solving skills. The programme provides rigorous foundations of the concepts of Computer Science and its applications.

Bachelor of Business Administration (Financial Investment Analysis) BBA(FIA)

Head of the Department: Dr. Anuja Mathur

Bachelor of Business Administration (Financial Investment Analysis) is a core finance course, exposes you to all important concepts from Financial management to derivatives, from statistics to economics which are the basis for going forward and making a career in this field. The programme is focused to create financial expertise to contribute to emerging India. This programme is a true value addition in professional education in the field of finance at an early stage of under graduation.

Post Graduate Diploma in Cyber Security and Law (PGDCSL)

Programme Coordinator: Dr. Anamika Gupta

Post Graduate Diploma in Cyber Security and Law (PGDCSL) programme is an advanced Penetration Testing & Information Security Training Engineering Program: The course provides an intensive training which will empower an individual with practical knowledge in a simplified and easily graspable manner. In the course, students will learn how hackers break into the systems, network, mobiles and website so as to make them aware of the possible loopholes and therefore, making them proficient in reverse-penetration.

Student Enrollment

This year the admission process to BMS and BBA (FIA) Programs was done through Common University Entrance Test (CUET) in an online mode. The students seeking admission to BMS and BBA(FIA) programs were required to appear in one language from List A, Mathematics/Applied Mathematics, and General Test. The end selection was based on the rank computed from the CUET scores obtained from the abovementioned combination of subjects. The written entrance test was conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). Overall, 294 students were admitted in BMS and 146 students in BBA (FIA).

The admission to B. Sc. (H) Computer Science was conducted through Central University Entrance Test (CUET) online for the academic session 2023-24. The students seeking admission to B.Sc. (H) Computer Science was required to appear in one language from List A, Mathematics, and two other subjects (one from list B1). The selection was based on the rank computed from the CUET scores obtained from the above-mentioned combination of subjects. After allotment of the students to college, the Admissions committee verified all the documents online and completed the admission process. In total, 66 students were admitted to the B. Sc. (H) Computer Science course.

Admission to PGDCSL requires a Bachelors or above in Science or Technology with following papers: Programming, Networking, Database management, Operating Systems, and Data Structure. The admissions are based on the merit drawn based on the marks obtained in eligible degrees. Altogether, 32 students were admitted in PGDCSL

Major Highlights

IQAC (Internal Quality Assurance Cell)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is an integral part of the learning environment of SSCBS. Constituted under the aegis of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) requirements, the IQAC includes representatives of all stakeholders, viz., Administration, Faculty, Students, Alumni and Recruiters; who work together to enhance the learning environment in the college.

Diverse opinions add to the perspectives of the IQAC. In 2023-24, the IQAC was ably supplemented by the viewpoints of multi-talented individuals including Prof. Kavita Sharma (as Management nominee); Dr. Meenu (as Parent representative); Dr. Pushpender Kumar (as Alumnus of SSCBS); and Vikas Goyal (as Industry/ Employer).

Additionally, as part of various initiatives, IQAC and SSCBS invites eminent resource persons from the industry and academia who share their insights and experiences to help raise the academic and operational processes and standards of the college.

In order to help provide a platform for all stakeholders to interact effectively, the IQAC regularly holds formal meetings with all the stakeholders to help to decide upon and take action on a Road Map to improve the quality of college functioning and to take stock of the progress made on various aspects of the road map.

Though the IQAC is involved with almost all aspects of the college, it has taken some special actions during 2023-24 with the aim of improving the academic and operational activities in the college.

1. Mentoring, Counselling and related

SSCBS IQAC strongly believes that a healthy mind is imperative for the modern student. In addition to ongoing programs (viz. mentorship sessions, faculty mentors for students and a dedicated counsellor etc.) to help students cope with the various stresses that they face, this year saw the launch of a student run initiative, Makes Sense that aims to provide more mentoring support for the students, this time by connecting them with professional counsellors via online mechanisms. This helps reduce hesitancy in the minds of the students to approach and avail of counselling services.

We have a professional counsellor Ms. Anisha Batra (M. Phil Clinical Psychology, registered with the Rehabilitation Council of India), with whom the students may book an appointment for seeking consultation. This is to help students develop healthy coping mechanisms for handling complexities of college life and enable them to timely address mental health issues like stress and anxiety. On a deeper level, this measure is to help students gain self-esteem and confidence. In 2023-24, 41 students benefitted from the counselling services.

Additionally, under the aegis of the CDC (the college placement cell) more initiatives to help strengthen the capabilities of the students have been undertaken. Connecting current students with alumni extra support by the Placement Officer and the CDC faculty in-charges have given more opportunities and avenues for students to share their problems and seek impactful support and guidance.

Overall, these initiatives helped to reduce stress levels in the students which in turn helped improve their mindset and quality of learning.

2. Workshops, Training and related

The SSCBS IQAC supports the thought that in a VUCA world, multi-faceted training is essential. While the students learn about academic concepts in class, supporting them with real-world challenges and applications is key.

The IQAC has always encouraged training and capability sessions for the students. Many of these sessions are held under the banner of the CDC and help students improve their skills and hone their personality. In the past year many workshops were organized by the CDC in association with corporate trainers covering capability building themes such as CV building, acing interview and working on personality development.

Rounding off the wholesome development agenda, many workshops were conducted to support the mental health of the students, including The Breath Workshop (20 Oct. 2023), FDP on Mental Health Awareness (11 Mar. 2024) and Ethics and Governance (11 Mar. 2024).

Enthusiastic participation by the students and faculty members in such workshops was heart-warming for the organisers.

Infrastructure

Our campus is spread over 5 acres with the latest amenities. A split-level 500+ seater auditorium supported with 4 well-equipped seminar halls are for events. 35 air-conditioned classrooms, all equipped with the latest AV equipment, focus on learning and enhance quality of interaction. A two-level well stocked library provides an opportunity for studying, while an amphitheater exists for student activities. There are air-conditioned hostel rooms, cafeteria-cum-mess area, administrative and common use areas and faculty rooms. A large underground parking lot, residential accommodation for faculty/staff members, an in-house STP plant, and a weather station are also present.

There are six computer labs, exclusive examination rooms, nine dedicated tutorial rooms, separate faculty rooms, an entire floor with an in-house incubation Centre and a placement cell. We also have a separate alumni relations cell.


Monitored CCTV cameras, gated security systems and well displayed and maintained fire and safety systems ensure safety, while ramps, lifts and other systems ensure that students/faculty with all manner of physical capabilities can access the facilities comfortably. The rooftop solar plant and solar water heaters support our environmental commitments in tandem with energy efficient building materials and tactics.

Facilities for Sports and Cultural Activities

The college accords high importance to the physical well-being and cultural expression of the students. The half-acre playground is well used by the students to partake in a wide-range of outdoor sports like football, cricket, volleyball, kabaddi, etc. Indoor sports facilities support sporting activities such as table tennis, carrom and chess. The college grounds also have a fully-equipped open gymnasium.

One end of the college grounds hosts a huge open-air stage that is used for practices of cultural events. It becomes the centerpiece of large open-air events, noticeably Crescendo, the annual cultural fest of the college. The grounds also play host to numerous other significant events such as Alumni meets, food fests and such like.

Akash Ganga, the college auditorium is fully air-conditioned, seats more than 500 people and is set up to conduct a variety of cultural events, conferences and discussions. More focused activities can make use of any of the 4 similarly equipped but slightly smaller (at approximately 100 seats) seminar rooms. At the other end, a garlanded bust of our namesake, Shaheed Sukhdev Thapar and the gaily fluttering national flag provide a touch of poignancy and help to channelize our efforts for greater national good.

Library is spread over two floors covering an area of approx. 1161 sq.m. and has designated space for reading rooms for 218 students and a research section for faculty members.



Library has institutional membership of NLIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) and DELNET and students are encouraged to access and make use of e-books and e-journals accessible through them. Library shares digital resources in the form of online magazine, journals and newspapers clippings along with the useful links to the articles with the users.

All college library activities such as circulation, technical processing, serial control and system administration are automated using the cloud based Open-Source Solution i.e. KOHA version 23.05.05.000 It provides easy access to the library catalogue (OPAC) from anywhere anytime. It enables students, faculty and staff members to check the status of the library resources and also maintains transparency in all the transactions by providing access to their personal accounts. In addition, Library is providing the online renewal facility for the students using the following link http://sscbs.bestbookbuddies.com/ We are one of the leading college libraries of University of Delhi using KOHA Open Source Integrated library management software shifted from LIBTEK DOS based library software since May 2014.

The library verifies its stock every year using the bar-code technology. Library has created and regularly updating its portal, https://sites.google.com/sscbsdu.ac.in/sscbslibrary/home which assimilates useful resources and serves as a gateway to easy access to a wide variety of resources like Web based OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue), E-Resources, Rare Books, Syllabus, Question Papers and Annual Reports along with the Blog etc. Question Papers are arranged Paper-wise under its Semester & Year-wise under each programme to provide one-point easy access to the students and faculty. It has QR Code for the Library Website for fast access through smart devices

Number per day usage of the library was calculated considering the physical footfalls of approx. 136 students per day and login data for online access to e-resources ((NLIST, DELNET, OPAC, and Library Website) by teachers and students is approx.46 students per day.

Apart from the print resources, teaching and research is also supported by accessing the large number of electronic resources (e-journals, e-books and databases) accessible through IP- based and Remote Access

facility of DU eLibrary. It also provides access to eShodhSindhu resources accessible through DULS. Awareness of online resources such as Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ), Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB), Internet Archives, eShodhganga and National Digital Library with the faculty members and students were shared. IRNIS Instance has been created for faculty research publications to showcase their citations and H - index.

Library Internship was given to five interns for the period of one month to make them learn the functionality of the library services.

IT Infrastructure

The college has six well-equipped modern computer laboratories, two for the BMS students, two for the B.Sc. (H) Computer Science students, one for the BFIA students and one for PGDCSL students. The College maintains and upgrades its IT infrastructure on a regular basis with the help of trained and experienced professionals. The continuous upgrades in IT infrastructure help and support in maintaining the college academics, administration, examinations and research related activities.

The college has in total 215 computers which include 189 computers available for academic purposes. All computer laboratories are equipped with LCD projectors to facilitate teaching and presentations. The college also has 25 printers which are available for students, teaching and non-teaching staff for academic and administrative purposes. Two internet connections, one from Delhi University with a speed of 100Mbps and another from MTNL with a speed of 1000 Mbps, are available through LAN and Wi-Fi in the whole campus (Classrooms, Labs, Library, Placement & SIIF Area, Hostels, Canteen & Mess Area, Staff rooms, Administrative Offices, Accounts Section, Auditorium, Seminar Halls etc.). Wi-Fi facility is made available through 133 Access Points (APs) centrally managed by one Wireless Controller (Zone Director). To control the overall network in the campus the college has installed 01 Nos NMS (Base NMS- 25 Devices / 250 Thin APS), 03 Nos Servers HP ProLiant DL380 Gen 9 Server with Windows Server Data Center Edition and for internet security it has also installed 01 Nos UTM (Fortigate FG1200D) with Fortiguard (IPS & Application Control, Antivirus, Web Filtering). The college has access to many licensed and open source software such as Dev C++, CPUSim 4.0, MS Excel, TORA, Ubuntu, Anaconda, Mathematica / Scilab, Eclips, Turbo Assembler, NetBeans, Prolog, Xamp, Notepad++, Oracle, Android Studio, SPSS, Capital Line, Microsoft Office (professional edition), E views, Windows Server 2016 Datacenter Edition, MySQL, Visual Studio, Google GSuite for Education, Tally, Adobe Acrobat Pro which are used by students from all three departments of the college. These software are also updated as per the changing need of the academic curriculum. The college, through its website, provides a platform for students to view their attendance on a real time basis and internal assessment at the end of each semester.

For better connectivity in the campus the college also has an intercom facility (EPABX) which is a private telephone network used by college teaching and nonteaching staff for easy and effective communication. The college also ensures safety of all individuals in the campus with the help of CCTV surveillance through 138 cameras including PTZ (rotating) on the different floors, library, labs, canteen & mess, open area & ground, lifts, entry and exit gates, hostels, auditorium, parking etc.

Extension and Outreach Activities

SSCBS stands by the motto "We rise by lifting others". The goal of all outreach activities undertaken at SSCBS is to identify major social problems affecting people's lives and take steps to overcome them. Various activities for the betterment and uplift of society are undertaken through the societies of the college.

GirlUp Ruhi, SSCBS, initiated impactful endeavors in 2023-24. A significant event was the Breast Cancer Awareness session led by Dr. Vandhana Rajgopal, engaging around 100 students. Discussions centered on symptoms, early detection, and treatment options, complemented by a live demonstration promoting inclusivity. Another noteworthy initiative was a CUET-UG Awareness Session at a local boys' school, attended by approximately 100 students. Detailed guidance on exam essentials and a dedicated doubt resolution session aimed to empower aspiring students. Additionally, GirlUp Ruhi hosted a compelling Women's Day Speaker Session featuring Ms. Ismini Panagopoulou and Ms. Poonam Agarwal. Their insights on workplace challenges and empowerment resonated with attendees. Beyond these, GirlUp Ruhi organized the Pride Palette Event celebrating Pride Month, fostering inclusivity. A Women's Day Board Activity encouraged attendees to share about their ideal women, promoting gratitude and gender equality. These initiatives underscore GirlUp Ruhi's dedication to empowerment, awareness, inclusivity, and gender equality, nurturing a supportive community at Shaheed Sukhdev College Business Studies.

Enactus, a student-run organization empowering communities through social entrepreneurship, impressed in various competitions (2023-24). They tackled B-plan challenges at StartupGala (SRCC) and Nirmaan (Sri Venkateswara) presenting projects like 'Kaagazi' (focus area not mentioned). Competitions like Pitch Perfect (FMS) and Prarambh (NSUT) demanded presentations highlighting the problem, solution, financial projections, and social impact of their ventures. Enactus also thrived in pitching existing projects. Events like IgniteX (XLRI) and C2P Social Entrepreneurship Summit (SRCC) tested their ability to explain project feasibility, scalability, and business models to a panel. They even championed 'Kaagazi' at Aavishkaran (BVP) and Envision (SGGSCC). Enactus' adaptability extended to sustainability-focused competitions. Eco Showdown (ARSD) and Race to Revival (LSR) required crafting sustainable business ideas within a tight timeframe, incorporating them into sales pitches with auctions. Enactus even developed a sustainability-focused marketing campaign for a project in Entrigue (CVS). These competitions undeniably showcase Enactus' diverse project portfolio and their remarkable talent in tailoring presentations to various competition formats.

Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies (SSCBS) social services arm, Kartavya, along with the National Service Scheme (NSS) unit, works relentlessly to empower underprivileged communities (2023-24). Project Saksham focuses on financial independence for underprivileged youth of all ages by equipping them with knowledge about careers (all fields), essential skills, and government support programs. Project Furry cares for stray animals (dogs, cows, cats, rabbits) by providing food, shelter, and medical attention, serving hundreds of animals in need. They've also championed gender equality through Project Muskan, conducting workshops on Durga Puja safety, mental health, and menstrual hygiene. Kartavya's dedication extends beyond immediate needs. In 2023-24, they organized successful donation drives for clothes and food, directly impacting countless individuals. Recognizing the importance of practical education, Kartavya has partnered with various industries, benefiting students by bridging the gap between

academics and real-world careers. This impactful collaboration has exposed students to current industry trends and practical skills. Additionally, Kartavya has fostered international connections by establishing partnerships with esteemed foreign universities, promoting knowledge exchange and cultural enrichment Eco Club SSCBS at Shaheed Sukhdev College Business Studies is dedicated to promoting sustainability through various initiatives such as tree plantation, waste management, and educational seminars. They collaborate with local organizations, organize clean-up drives, and encourage participation in environmental competitions, fostering an eco-conscious mindset among students.

In 2023-24, the club achieved significant milestones by conducting a cleanliness drive at the Ridge Reserve Forest in Collaboration with 'There is No Earth B', installing of Green Wall at the college campus with 70+ plants, and Japanese Park Cleanliness Drive, collecting 35 kilograms of waste.

Various other major events to be noted were, a visit to Bharte Kadam NGO during Diwali to raise awareness regarding, the cleanliness drive at Sanjay Van, clearing over 15 kilograms of waste, showcasing the impact of community engagement in environmental preservation, visit Amrit Udyan, offering rich learning experiences in biodiversity and conservation, reinforcing environmental awareness among members. Eco Club SSCBS also conducted an environmental session with the CEO of SustainEco on environmental preservation, featuring dynamic exchanges and discussions on influential environmental movements like the Chipko Aandolan.

These initiatives and events demonstrate Eco Club SSCBS's commitment to sustainability, community engagement, and environmental education, fostering a greener and cleaner future.

Firstly, in collaboration with CRY, CDF, SSCBS successfully conducted a Live Project addressing cybersecurity concerns among government school students. Through interactive workshops, they were able to educate over 500 students on cyber scams and preventive measures, fostering digital literacy and a sense of responsibility. Additionally, value-adding speaker sessions have been conducted, including the one featuring Mr. Vikash Dhar, an experienced entrepreneur and banker, who shared insights on entrepreneurship and bank insurance, inspiring attendees to explore new avenues in business and finance.

Furthermore, CDF and SSCBS set up a stall under Viti'23 offering a relaxing atmosphere with interactive games and homemade treats, fostering community connections and providing attendees with moments of respite and enjoyment. Moreover, CDF also has undertaken regular visits to local NGOs focused on the upliftment of the children through computer skills training and recreational activities, fostering joy and empowerment among participants.

Lastly, the ongoing Project Utsav aims to support the potter community by providing income opportunities through collaborations with campus facilities and local cafes, enabling them to sell their handmade products online and offline. These initiatives reflect CDF's commitment to community engagement, empowerment, and fostering meaningful connections both within and beyond the college campus.

Throughout the past year, the Rotaract Club actively served the community through a multitude of initiatives. In May 2023, they partnered with the Rotary Club of Faridabad Midtown to host a Blood Drive, collecting 12 vital blood units. This life-saving effort highlighted the community's commitment to supporting healthcare. July saw a multifaceted Community Service Programme in Rohini, where we addressed essential issues like dental hygiene, menstrual health, and water conservation. By distributing dental kits, facilitating pad donations, and promoting water-saving techniques, they fostered holistic well-being and raised awareness about these crucial matters.

Demonstrating the power of collective action, another Blood Donation Drive was held near Janyug Apartments, resulting in the collection of approximately 12 blood units. This event solidified the community spirit of Rotaract and the importance of voluntary blood donation in saving lives.

Environmental stewardship was a key focus as well. Project Greenovation, spearheaded by the Rotaract Club of GL Bajaj, aimed to combat pollution and promote a greener future. Through a three-day Plantation Donation Drive, the community united to plant saplings across households, fostering a culture of sustainability and collective responsibility for the planet.

Empowering individuals was another facet of the Rotaract Club's efforts. Project Aadmaraksha, organized by the Rotaract Club of Delhi Vibrance, offered a self-defense workshop at the Delhi School of Professional Studies and Research. This initiative equipped attendees with practical skills to enhance personal safety, fostering a sense of empowerment within the community.

The North East Cell of the college organized a movie screening on September 22, 2023, which continued to foster cross-cultural communication and constructive discourse on Northeast India. In response to the needs of our community, it conducted a Donation Drive for Manipur and Sikkim victims from December 7-9, 2023, demonstrating commitment to socioeconomic diversity and support. The Northeast Cell Fest held on April 30 - May 1, 2024, included various stall setups, further promoting the rich cultural heritage. These initiatives collectively create a supportive and inclusive atmosphere, encouraging mutual respect and appreciation of diverse backgrounds.



However, that is not the truth, and so Kartavya came up with a series called "You Are Not Alone", wherein we shared success stories against mental illness of famous celebrities. The Rotaract Club of SSCBS hosted "Dard-e-disco", an effective period pain simulator event on 30th April 2024. Over 200 people actively participated in the event, which radiated fervor and

The gathering promoted a more tolerant and understanding community by providing a secure environment for candid discussion.

5. Other Initiatives

- Dog Collar Activity: This initiative focused on enhancing the safety of street dogs, who are often invisible to drivers after dark, leading to frequent and tragic accidents. Volunteers were trained to gently and effectively place the reflective collars on the dogs, while giving them treats, ensuring their comfort and safety.
- Project Bachpan: Rotaract SSCBS collaborated with Hamaraa Mission Dignity which is an NGO that focuses on providing basic education and healthcare services to underprivileged children. Under this collab we wanted to educate children about Republic Day in a fun way. Various activities were conducted like flag drawing, quizzes on Republic Day, flag distribution and singing and dancing with talented kids.
- Trans Shelter Visit: This project aimed at spending time with Transgender people at Mitr Trust in Dabri, New Delhi. many of whom are orphans. Our team went to meet

them. We played games like antakshari. The day went great with long discussions regarding their childhood life. Many of them to our surprise were running businesses.

- Children's shelter visit: This initiative focused on promoting creative learning during our visit to an NGO. (Don Bosco Ashalayam, Dwarka). The donated books and materials were distributed among the children to support their educational needs. A drawing competition was organized where children could express themselves, an origami session was held where children created beautiful paper wonders, we cut a cake and gave gifts to the children.
- Food Donation Drive: Rotaract District organized a food donation drive on 25th January, 2024. Members of Rotaract, SSCBS went to the site and took part in the drive, distributing food packets including biscuits and flour to the homeless.
- **Cloth Donation Drive:** A mega clothing drive was organized where members distributed donated clothes to people living in the Peeragarhi Slums.
- Vikas Shubhakshika NGO visit: Project VIKAS concentrated on the children's creativity in addition to their basic education and literacy. Along with teaching them to write their names in English, we also taught them how to do it in a gorgeous, creative way that encompasses a range of colors and styles. We also provided them with the necessary stationery to encourage their creativity and inspired them to broaden their horizons by allowing them to sketch whatever they want. We also requested that they attempt to create the Rotaract SSCBS logo. They also asked to be allowed to dance to whatever music they wanted. We saw some fantastic, energetic performances. We gave out rewards for every outstanding achievement, along with some toffees.
- Jagruti: The SSCBS Rotaract Club organised a very educational and influential menstruation workshop for underprivileged women in a local slum as part of Project Jagruti. The session dispelled myths and promoted candid conversation to eradicate the taboo and shame around menstruation. Free menstruation products were distributed to attendees as part of the session's pad distribution component. Additional keynote addresses focused on promoting understanding of the menstrual cycle, hygiene management, and possible health hazards linked to inappropriate menstrual habits.
- Pavitra: The Rotaract Club of SSCBS organized a community service programme focused on distributing dental kits, sanitary pad donations, and promoting water conservation. The event was held at a Rohini, where a committed group of volunteers engaged with attendees, spread knowledge about dental care, and gave approximately forty individuals vital dental kits. More than 15 individuals received dental kits as part of this programme, which included mouthwash, toothpaste, toothbrushes, and dental floss. Sanitary pads were also given to those in need, demonstrating their wise recognition of the need of menstruation hygiene.
- Ahaan: Project Ahaan was organised by the SSCBS Rotaract Club to promote environmental awareness and serve as a symbol of such concerns. It also highlighted harmoniously collaborating and imparting knowledge on responsible coexistence by initiating a tree plantation drive. They made a deliberate decision to begin at home, where they cleaned their surroundings and their dwellings. Like the Chipko Movement, the human-environment symbiotic link was the real highlight of the day at this event.

- **Pratirakshan:** The Rotaract Club of SSCBS formed a dedicated team to conduct a workshop in the Madrasi slum of Pitampura, Delhi, aimed at raising awareness about the dangers of stagnant water, particularly with the upcoming rainy season.
- Kriti: Project Kriti celebrated and supported Indian handloom and weavers under the themes of community service and economic development. The initiative encouraged people to wear traditional clothing made by local weavers, ensuring fair prices and increased demand for their products. The project honored the artisans' craftsmanship and heritage, creating a sense of recognition and appreciation, while also promoting eco-friendly handloom products, contributing to environmental conservation.
- Vardi: Project Vardi was an initiative to honor the "harbingers of peace" in our community-dedicated law enforcement officials. We aimed to recognize their unwavering commitment to public safety and to enhance the community's understanding of their vital role. The initiative focused on bridging the gap between the police and the public by fostering dialogue and mutual respect.
- Plantation Drive: The plantation drive was a refreshing and environmentally conscious activity aimed at enhancing the local green cover. The participants spread out to plant various native trees and shrubs. By raising awareness and encouraging sustainable practices, the drive contributed to a healthier, more resilient environment for future generations.
