Event 1) Bharat Neeti

Event 4) Viksit Bharat Nari Shakti Conclave event

Event 5) Cynosure 2024: Embracing the vision of Viksit Bharat@2047

Cynosure 2024, the annual flagship event of The Darkroom SSCBS, was a celebration of visual arts that brought together photography enthusiasts from across the campus and beyond. This year, we had the unique opportunity to align our event with the visionary theme of "Viksit Bharat @2047", which envisions a **prosperous** and **harmonious** Bharat with modern infrastructure, sustainable development, and opportunities for all citizens. Our goal was to capture the essence of this theme through a dedicated photo exhibition and an online photography competition, showcasing the aspirations and potential of a developed India by 2047.

Event 6) Viksit Bharat Essay Writing Competition

The event aimed to foster creativity, critical thinking, and a sense of patriotism among students, encouraging them to articulate their visions for a developed India. Event 7) Viksit Bharat Run

The "Run for Viksit Bharat" was held at Delhi University's North Campus on May 8, 2024, with over 8,000 students from more than 80 colleges participating. The 2.5-kilometer run started at 7 AM at Gate No. 1, went through Gate No. 4, and ended at the university's sports complex. The event was organised by Delhi University in collaboration with the Vikas Bharat Ambassador Club to encourage students to vote in the Lok Sabha elections. The run's goal was to raise awareness in society about making India a developed nation by 2047.







Event 8) Independence Day Celebrations

The NSS unit, alongside various student clubs, organized a series of events from 13th to 15th August to celebrate India's Independence Day, focusing on patriotism, unity, and environmental awareness. The celebrations involved enthusiastic participation from students, faculty, and special guests. Highlights included **Kartavya's Pin Board Activity** on 13th August, which engaged over 50 students to contribute patriotic messages and art. On 14th August, the **NSS organized a spirited campus march** with students holding flags and chanting slogans, reflecting unity and dedication.

The 15th August festivities included a quiz by **CDF** and **EcoClub** on **India's history** and **environmental issues**, aimed at engaging students in meaningful discussions. The celebrations also included a floral tribute to the statue of freedom fighter Sukhdev and a symbolic faculty march. The Chief Guest, **Gunjan Gupta**, honored the occasion with a stirring address on unity, followed by the flag-hoisting ceremony.

Event 9) Blood Donation Camp

On 13th September, **NSS SSCBS**, in collaboration with **Chandra Laxmi Hospital**, organized a **blood donation** camp at college venue 039. In alignment with the **Viksit Bharat** mission, this initiative encouraged students and faculty to contribute to national health by donating blood, a **critical resource in saving lives**. Running from 9 AM to 5 PM, the camp attracted enthusiastic participation from the college community.

With over **90 students**, faculty members, and staff volunteering to donate blood, the event underscored a shared commitment to healthcare as a collective responsibility. Key activities included donor registration and medical screening, an informative session by Chandra Laxmi healthcare professionals on the benefits of blood donation, and the blood collection process managed by trained staff to ensure a safe, hygienic experience. Post-donation, refreshments and rest areas supported donors in their recovery.

The camp made a significant impact, with **25 liters of blood collected** to support local healthcare needs, especially for emergency transfusions and surgeries. This initiative raised awareness about the critical need for regular blood donation and fostered a sense of social responsibility among participants, echoing the spirit of the Viksit Bharat mission.
