Poverty teaches us gratitude and simplicity of life, how small things matter, and how we can find happiness in the most trivial things. It also pushes us to be more mature and achieve more.






I did not wait for him to interject.



In a Celtic Legend, two Kings sit atop a hill playing chess while their armies fight. Without them knowing, the variations of the battle follow the same course of their match. At the end of the day, one king defeats the other and knocks down the chessboard, shortly after a battered knight arrives and says, "Your army flees sire, you have lost your reign". This fable holds the view that many held and still hold), that chess mirrors life.

When the Arabs first brought the game to Europe, there were 5 chess pieces, namely Chariots, Elephants, Cavalry, Pawns, the Advisor, and the King. Back then, the Advisor (which evolved into the Queen over the subsequent centuries) could only move one square diagonally at a time. The progress was slow and games would often last days. The game was enjoyed only by the wealthy and the elite. However, with the invention of the printing press in the 15th century, the game was brought to the masses. Changes were made in the game itself as well when Bishops, Knights, and Rooks replaced pieces.

The most significant of these changes occurred when in 1492, the Advisor was changed to the Queen in Spain during Isabella I's reign, and the powers of rook and the bishop were added to the piece (sadly, this was called the Mad Woman's Rule). This change was a testament to the prominence of medieval queens such as Eleanor of Aquitaine and Blanche of Castile and Isabella I of Castile, the cult of the Virgin Mary, and the increasing influence of women during the Italian Renaissance. The evolution of the Queen piece meant that the games were faster, fluid and brought a much-needed balance to the game. The game had a few more revisions and additions in the subsequent centuries (en passant and castling were added).


In 1886 the first world champion was crowned and to date, there have been 16 different world champions. Despite this, the game has somewhat stagnated. The media and society at large consider chess a hobby and not much else.

There isn't much money to be made playing chess and only the top Grand Masters can make a decent living out of chess and even then, there are wild disparities in pay between chess federations. Chess also has lost the geopolitical context it once had when Fischer played Spassky in 1972 during the cold war. Chess also hasn't made much progress on the women's front. Women's tournaments are underfunded and largely ignored by the mainstream media (of the 1600 grandmasters only 37 are women). Parents and coaches still prefer playing women in women-only tournaments and not open tournaments, which understandably hampers their progress.

The Covid-19 induced lockdown and the immensely popular Netflix show 'The Queen's Gambit' have worked wonders for chess. The Netflix show was watched worldwide by 62 million people, and subsequently, the number of chess users of online chess servers like 'Chess.com' and 'Lichess' increased by over 200%. The chess servers also reported a slight improvement in gender breakdown in the users of these chess servers. Through platforms like Twitch and YouTube, chess has certainly seen a new generation of enthusiasts tuning in. During an amateur chess tournament on Twitch called 'Pogchamps', viewership of the event crossed 100,000 (an unprecedented number in viewership in chess). This recent success in chess can also be attributed to the ease of playing online on chess servers through rapid, blitz, and bullet time controls.

Chess is a 1500-year-old game that has gone through a myriad of changes. It has been influenced and is influenced by culture and people. It is intrinsic, boundless, and beautiful and I think the Celtic fable might be right after all.






History is chock-full of lies and misconceptions. The Earth was never believed to be flat in the medieval ages, The Vikings didn't wear horned helmets and The Pyramids weren't built by slaves(or aliens for that matter).

These lies and myths are however trivial when compared to the myth of the golden age, the lie of the Renaissance. The idea that we went from a period of disease-stricken, dark age (The Medieval ages) to an era of comfort and luxury, an era of scientific and cultural bloom is charming but highly misleading.

The mean life expectancy had dropped from 30-35 in the medieval ages to 18 years. The progress in different fields wasn't helping either- scientific innovations were making wars worse. Economic change(due to the pandemic) and increased trade meant diseases moving around and frequent outbreaks. The hoarding of money by the rich meant there were frequent coups and civil wars.

But how did all this happen? How did we make up the history for an entire period?





Culture as a form of war

If a leader wants to govern an area, the most important thing required is political legitimacy, that is, the people must recognize their new ruler. Something John Locke called 'consent of the governed.'

Hitler used the promise to return Germany to its glorious days. The British Raj in India used puppet governments. Today, most of the world is under democracy which is a peopleconsented government at its core.

In the 1500s, a new way to establish political legitimacy emerged, one fueled by increased wealth under the ruling class and decreased political stability. The rulers started spending a shit ton of money on art, architecture, and shows of grandeur. It was a way to show the commoners that their kingdom was prosperous and could afford their well-being. It also prevented wars and coups from happening for

Leonard Bruni was a historian in the 14th-15th century and he had grown up with the teachings of earlier historians like Petrarch. Petrarch had a hatred for the period he lived in and wrote that there would be a better time in the years to come, a golden era if you will.

Bruni was convinced he was living in the golden age Petrarch talked about. So he wrote with that in his mind. At times, he would make up events if they did not fit his tale.


One of the stories that Bruni told was that of Florence defeating 'The Viper of Milan.' The grandson of the Viper was mad, The Viper of Milan had never lost to Florence. But he understood that "Until the lion learns to write, every story would glorify the hunter." And so the grandson of The Viper did what he had to do. He wrote a story of his own, one in which The Viper had won and Milan itself was going through a golden period much like Bruni's Florence.

Soon Venice and France and England and every other kingdom and nation followed. Turns out claiming that your rule had brought about a golden period made for excellent political legitimacy. It's similar to what Hitler did when he talked about restoring the pride of Germany or how the MAGA movement in America works. You don't need to bring about a golden age, you just need people to believe that you will. Or in the case of The Renaissance, already had.

And so we started telling the story of The Renaissance. People in the 17th and 18th centuries used art and artefacts from the renaissance to impress. Any connection with the renaissance was valuable. And 19th-century governments used art from the period to gain...well, legitimacy.

As more value was given to the productions of the Renaissance, the art from the middle ages was neglected and suffered adding to this cycle of the myth of the Renaissance.

This is not to say the Renaissance was bad, just that it wasn't any better than the dark ages in terms of life quality. It was special for the fact that it achieved so much despite the challenges it faced. The masterpieces of The Renaissance were created as a desperate move. The Renaissance was a good era for our museums, not so much for the people of the time.




Bo Burnham's new special "Inside" was released on Netflix. He recorded it in his room with no audience, no crew, just him and his vast imagination. Throughout his career, he was known for his stand-up comedy but the global pandemic had put his aspirations to return at a standstill indefinitely. He figured out a way to express himself to his audience by filming this special.

Burnham makes it clear that the narrative arc of the special will be self-referential. It's a series of musical numbers and skits that are inherently about the creation of comedy itself. It's not meant to be funny but to expose the ironies of what we assume or how society perceives the relationship between two things.

It starts as a lockdown comedy special in isolation without an audience and then turns into a full-scale existential breakdown.

The pandemic brought along a lot of uncertainties and challenging times, forcing everything to go online. Society meetings have not been the same as they used to be and initially it felt quite different while


interacting over the internet medium, but we learnt to adapt ourselves with the changing environment over the time.



Yuva. in collaboration with LeanStudio

(California), conducted an online certification workshop on Lean Startup Methodology by Mr. Ryan MacCarrigan, renowned for his experience in Silicon Valley. In April, amidst the challenging times, we nurtured a first-ofits-kind global collaboration with the **National University of Singapore to organize** Springboard 2021, a global start-up ideation challenge. We took up several Live Projects with start-ups in the domains of Travel and **Event Management to facilitate learning and** aid these start-ups in securing seed funding. We held regular knowledge-sharing sessions through fortnightly online meetings for the members of the society on topics ranging from Networking to Graphic Designing and Tableau. DiscoverE, Upstarter, Sagetics Consulting, MyMoMa, and Thred are some of the ventures started up by our team members during the year. Yuva did its part in this pandemic by donating to organizations like SaveLife Foundation, Kailash Satyarthi Foundation, and Corona Sewa Kendra, to assist those in need.


Besides, the Student Council left no stone overturned to ensure that every student felt

THE CBS POST





THE LITERARY SOCIETY





