Community Visit Report - Lal Bagh ki Juggi

The visit to **Lal Bagh ki Juggi**, located near **Mansarovar Park 2**, was undertaken with the primary aim of understanding the **willingness of the community to work**, and to identify potential contributors for **Project Dravya**, specifically in the making of **BSG briquettes**.

The settlement is home to people of all age groups, with a significant presence of **men aged 21–35 years**, and an average family size of **around 6 members**. Children mostly fall in the **12–15 years** age group. While some attend local schools, others participate in NGO-led educational initiatives.

The socio-economic conditions are marked by seasonal employment and informal jobs. The majority of men work as instrument players during weddings, operate bullock carts, or work as ragpickers and vegetable vendors. Women, primarily housewives, often engage in ragpicking or exchange personal belongings like hair and old clothes for food or cash.

During the interaction, most residents expressed a **strong willingness to work** and showed **enthusiasm for being part of Project Dravya**. Interestingly, some women also revealed their **skills in stitching clothes**, which opens further avenues for skill-based engagement. In addition, we observed that cooking was mainly done using **wood-fired methods**, leading to both **health and environmental concerns**.

We **interviewed several individuals** about their current livelihoods and future aspirations. Upon sharing details of our project, **most respondents showed a keen interest** in contributing to the initiative. We carefully documented their **living conditions and employment potential**, and found them **well-suited for collaboration** in Project Dravya.

This visit reaffirmed that Lal Bagh ki Juggi hosts a **highly motivated and resourceful community**, capable of making meaningful contributions when provided with the right opportunities.
