About Shaheed Sukhdev Thapar

Freedom Fighter (15th May 1907 - 23rd March 1931)

Shaheed Sukhdev Thapar was a prominent Indian revolutionary who dedicated his life to the struggle against British colonial rule. Born in Ludhiana, Punjab, he grew up witnessing the injustices and oppression of the British Raj, which deeply influenced his resolve to fight for India's independence. A close associate of Bhagat Singh and Shivaram Rajguru, Sukhdev co-founded the *Naujawan Bharat Sabha* to inspire and mobilize the youth toward the freedom movement.

As a senior member of the *Hindustan Socialist Republican Association (HSRA)*, he played a key role in organizing revolutionary activities across Punjab. He is best remembered for his involvement in the *Lahore Conspiracy Case* of 1928, linked to the assassination of British officer J.P. Saunders in retaliation for the death of Lala Lajpat Rai. Following the *Central Assembly Hall bombings* in Delhi on 8 April 1929, Sukhdev was arrested along with Bhagat Singh and Rajguru.

After a high-profile trial, the three were sentenced to death and executed on 23 March 1931 in Lahore Central Jail. Sukhdev was only 23 years old. His sacrifice, along with his comrades, is commemorated annually on **Shaheedi Diwas** (23 March), honoring their courage, patriotism, and enduring legacy in India's freedom struggle.



About the College

Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies (SSCBS) is one of the premier institutions of the University of Delhi, imparting path-breaking education in the fields of Management and Information Technology. It was established in August 1987 by the Government of the National Capital Territory of Delhi (GNCTD) on the initiation of University Grants Commission (UGC) and the Ministry of Human Resources and Development, Government of India (MHRD).

At present, the college offers three full-time graduate programs under its three departments - Departments of Management Studies (DMS) and Department of Computer Science (DCS) leading to the award of Bachelor of Management Studies, Bachelor of Business Administration (Financial Investment Analysis) and B.Sc. (H) Computer Science.

The college also offers a post graduate diploma course in Cyber Security and Law. The college emphasizes an interactive mode of education, supported with innovative teaching methodologies. It is designed to stimulate inquiring minds and provide significant exposure to the realities of business processes and challenges. Industry interaction is achieved through guest lectures, industrial tours, industry-based project work, live projects, internships and summer training. The strength of the college lies in its highly qualified faculty having industrial experience, dynamic students, supportive non-teaching staff, illustrious alumni and a supportive and encouraging governing body.

The college supports about 47 student societies working in diverse areas including strengthening students' skills in various domains (such as marketing, finance, technology and entrepreneurship), social outreach, mental and emotional health, environment etc.



It gives me immense pleasure to present the 38th Annual Report of Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies, marking yet another milestone in our journey of excellence and growth. From being the first college in the University of Delhi to introduce Business Studies—now offered as the Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS)—SSCBS has consistently nurtured a legacy of innovation, resilience, and academic distinction.



Our pursuit of excellence has once again been nationally recognized, with India Today ranking SSCBS as the Best Undergraduate College in June 2025 for the sixth consecutive year, alongside our prestigious ‘A+’ NAAC grade.

At present, SSCBS offers three undergraduate honours programmes—BMS, BBA (Financial Investment Analysis), and B.Sc. (Computer Science)—as well as a postgraduate programme in Cyber Security and Law. In addition, industry-driven certification courses in Analytics, Digital Marketing, Financial Modeling, Capital Markets, Wealth Planning, and FinTech equip our students with future-ready skills.

The SSCBS Innovation and Incubation Foundation (SIIF) continues to be a vital contributor to India’s startup ecosystem. In 2024–25 alone, SIIF funded ₹20 million across 11 startups and mentored 15 promising ideas. Collectively, these ventures generated revenues of ₹6.8 million, reflecting the entrepreneurial zeal of our students. Placements remain one of our strongest pillars. This year, 77 recruiters made over 220 offers. The highest CTC touched ₹28 LPA, with the average at ₹11.49 LPA.

Recruiters included leading firms such as BCG, McKinsey, Bain, Accenture, D.E. Shaw, AB InBev, and Maruti. More than 70 students secured admissions to premier global universities, while internships with stipends of up to ₹95,000 per month further enhanced industry exposure. Our students also brought laurels on the global stage—emerging winners in case competitions hosted by Harvard, MIT, Stanford, NUS, and HKU, and representing India at the Global Entrepreneurship Mindset Programme in Japan. Beyond academics, SSCBS remains deeply committed to shaping socially responsible leaders. Our societies actively contribute to social and environmental causes, while student well-being is supported by the presence of a dedicated clinical psychologist on campus.

As we look to the future, SSCBS will continue to uphold its mission of delivering quality education in an environment that fosters creativity, collaboration, and compassion. Institutional Excellence

SSCBS is ranked No. 1 in the India Today–MDRA Best Colleges 2025 (BBA stream) for the sixth consecutive year and figures in the NIRF 2024 (College category) Top-150; the college also holds a NAAC A+ grade.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is a vital component of SSCBS, established in line with the requirements of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) . It comprises representatives from all key stakeholder groups—Administration, Faculty, Students, Alumni, and Recruiters—who collaborate to continuously enhance the college’s learning environment.

The diversity of perspectives within the IQAC enriches its decision-making. In 2024–25, the cell benefited from the expertise of distinguished members, including Prof. Anupam Jha (Management Nominee), Ms. Sonia Misti (Parent Representative), Dr. Pushpender Kumar (Alumnus), and Mr. Vikas Goyal (Industry Representative).

As part of its initiatives, IQAC and SSCBS regularly invite eminent industry leaders and academicians to share insights that help strengthen academic and operational standards. Over the past year, two formal meetings with all stakeholders were held to review progress and refine the Road Map for institutional improvement.

While IQAC contributes to almost every aspect of college functioning, in 2024–25 it undertook several focused initiatives:

- **Expanding Student Workshops:** In collaboration with the Career Development Centre (CDC), IQAC organized skill-building sessions on interview preparation, advanced Excel, data analytics, and case study analysis, led by alumni CXOs and renowned experts.
- **Streamlining Summer Internships:** Strengthened policies, structured processes, and rigorous evaluation have enhanced the effectiveness of internships, ensuring students gain maximum corporate exposure.
- **Improving Access to Knowledge Resources:** A notable achievement was securing a full subscription to the Harvard Business Review catalog, providing world-class articles, case studies, and simulations. The library further expanded access through online databases, additional books and journals, and advanced digital management tools.
- **Enhancing Mentorship and Counselling:** Recognizing the growing stress among students, IQAC partnered with internal and external stakeholders to expand mentorship and counselling services, promoting well-being and personal growth.

Through these initiatives, IQAC continues to drive academic excellence and operational efficiency, reinforcing SSCBS’s commitment to holistic student development.

Programs and Curriculum

Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS).

A 4-year program aligned with NEP 2020, offering multiple entry/exit options, strong core coverage (Financial Accounting, Marketing, Business Economics, Organisational Behaviour, Quantitative Techniques, Strategic Management, Business Law), electives by interest, and a capstone in Year 4 (Research Dissertation, Entrepreneurship Project, or

Academic Project). Emphasis on experiential learning through case studies, internships, industry visits, workshops, and simulations.

Bachelor of Business Administration (Financial Investment Analysis) BBA(FIA)

BBA (FIA) is a specialized honours program with a strong emphasis on research and analytical rigor, designed to develop foundational expertise in finance. The curriculum is tailored to meet the demands of India's rapidly evolving economy, with a focus on key areas such as banking and financial services, investment and fund management, corporate financial management, and financial risk management.

Students are equipped with a robust understanding of statistical, quantitative, and econometric tools essential for effective financial analysis and decision-making. Through a blend of theoretical knowledge and practical application, the program prepares students to navigate complex financial environments and contribute meaningfully to the future of financial innovation and growth in India.

B.Sc. (Hons.) Computer Science.

The computer science department at Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies has the objective of imparting quality education in the field of Computer Science. With the rapidly evolving technology and the continuous need for innovation, the college offers modern facilities for teaching, learning and research. Focused on analytical and computational thinking with modern facilities for teaching, learning, and research.

Post-Graduate Diploma in Cyber Security and Law (PGDCSL).

Advanced penetration testing and information security training that equips students with practical reverse-penetration skills across systems, networks, mobile, and web.

Programme Coordinator: Prof. Anamika Gupta.

Certification courses offered during the year included: Data Analytics & Business Intelligence (125 hrs), Digital Marketing (100 hrs), Financial Modeling & Algo Trading (160 hrs), NSE Capital Market Professional (100 hrs), FinTech (60 hrs), Business Intelligence, Data Visualization & Automation (75 hrs), and Accredited Wealth Planner with AV Financial Experts Network Pvt. Ltd. (FinX) started January 2025.

Admissions and Enrollment

Admissions were through CUET (NTA, online). BMS and BBA (FIA) required one language from List A, Mathematics/Applied Mathematics, and the General Test. B.Sc. (H) Computer Science requires one language from List A, Mathematics, and two additional subjects (one mandatorily from List B1). Seat allocation via CSAS (University of Delhi). Enrolled: BMS 328, BBA (FIA) 167, B.Sc. (H) CS 69, PGDCSL 35; total 599 against 613 seats including supernumerary.

Admission to the Post Graduate Diploma in Cyber Security and Law (PGDCSL) requires a Bachelor's degree or higher in Science or Technology, with prior coursework in Programming Languages, Computer Networks, Database Management Systems, Operating Systems, and Data Structures. Selection is merit-based, determined by the marks obtained in the qualifying degree. A total of 35 students were admitted to the PGDCSL program.



Pedagogical Practices and Academic Support

Teaching connects classroom learning to real business contexts through guest lectures, industrial tours, industry-based projects, live projects, internships, and summer training. The model is enabled by qualified faculty with industry experience, motivated students, supportive staff, engaged alumni, and a strong Governing Body.

Library as a Learning Resource



The library has two floors (1161 sq m.) with seating for 218 and a faculty research section; 637 new titles; 26,101 total books; 56 magazines/journals and 14 newspapers and an average daily usage - 118 physical footfalls and 123 e-accesses.

The library has institutional membership of NLIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) and DELNET, and students are encouraged to access and make use of e-books and e-journals by organising the library orientation programs. The library shares digital resources in the form of online magazines, journals and newspaper clippings along with useful links to the articles with the users.

Automation on KOHA 24.05.03.000 with Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC), personal account access, online renewals for the students .It enables students, faculty and staff members to check the status of the library resources and also maintains transparency in all the transactions by providing access to their personal accounts. We are one of the leading college libraries of the University of Delhi, using KOHA Open Source Integrated library management software, shifted from LIBTEK DOS-based library software since May 2014.

Apart from the print resources, teaching and research are also supported by accessing the large number of electronic resources (e-journals, e-books and databases) accessible through IP-based and Remote Access of DU eLibrary, eShodhSindhu, and ONOS ejournals of 30 publishers.

Awareness of online resources such as the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ), the Directory of Open Access Books (DOAB), the Internet Archive, eShodhganga and the National Digital Library was shared with the faculty members and students. IRNIS Instance has been created for faculty research publications to showcase their citations and H-index.

A Library Internship was given to five interns for a period of one month to teach them the functionality of the library services.

IT Infrastructure & Digital Pedagogy

The college has five computer labs; 206 computers (189 academic), 25 printers; campus-wide LAN/Wi-Fi with DU 100 Mbps and MTNL 1000 Mbps; 133 access points; servers and licensed/open-source software stack across all departments. The continuous upgrades in IT infrastructure help and support in maintaining the college academics, administration, examinations and research-related activities.

All computer laboratories are equipped with LCD projectors to facilitate teaching and presentations. 25 printers are available for students, teaching and non-teaching staff for academic and administrative purposes. Two internet connections, one from Delhi University with a speed of 100Mbps and another from MTNL with a speed of 1000 Mbps, are available through LAN and Wi-Fi in the whole campus (Classrooms, Labs, Library, Placement & SIIF Area, Hostels, Canteen & Mess Area, Staff rooms, Administrative Offices, Accounts Section, Auditorium, Seminar Halls, etc.). Wi-Fi facility is made available through 133 Access Points (APs), centrally managed by one Wireless Controller (Zone Director). To control the overall network in the campus the college has installed 01 Nos NMS (Base NMS- 25 Devices / 250 Thin APS), 03 Nos Servers HP ProLiant DL380 Gen 9 Server with Windows Server Data Center Edition and for internet security it has also installed 01 Nos UTM (Fortigate FG1200D) with Fortiguard (IPS & Application Control, Antivirus, Web Filtering). The college has access to many licensed and open source software such as Dev C++, CPUSim 4.0, MS Excel, TORA, Ubuntu, Anaconda, Mathematica / Scilab, Eclipse, Turbo Assembler, NetBeans, Prolog, Xamp, Notepad++, Oracle, Android Studio, SPSS, Capital Line, Microsoft Office (professional edition), E views, Windows Server 2016 Datacenter Edition, MySQL, Visual Studio, Google GSuite for Education, Tally, Adobe Acrobat Pro which are used by students from all three departments of the college. These softwares are also updated as per the changing needs of the academic curriculum. The college, through its website, provides a platform for students to view their attendance on a real-time basis and internal assessment at the end of each semester.

For better connectivity in the campus, the college also has an intercom facility (EPABX,) which is a private telephone network used by college teaching and nonteaching staff for easy and effective communication. The college also ensures the safety of all individuals on the campus with the help of CCTV surveillance through 138 cameras, including PTZ (rotating) on the different floors, library, labs, canteen & mess, open area & ground, lifts, entry and exit gates, hostels, auditorium, parking, etc.

Website and ERP

The SSCBS website, accessible at <https://sscbs.du.ac.in/>, showcases an outstanding design concept coupled with visually captivating content. Developed in-house using an open-source platform, the website seamlessly integrates with an internally built Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system while adhering to the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) guidelines regarding the usage of cookies. Moreover, the website ensures failover protection through automated backups and boasts robust security measures with the implementation of Sucuri, a server hardening software. Upon visiting the website, users are greeted by a strategically designed landing page that presents the college's recent

achievements in a full-width format, igniting curiosity and engagement. With a unique design featuring colours inspired by the college's logo, the website enhances brand visibility. The website's content is optimised for search engines, ensuring minimal loading times and delivering an excellent mobile browsing experience.

The user-friendly interface of the SSCBS website organises primary tabs into detailed drop-down menus, facilitating hassle-free navigation and search. All information is systematically and aesthetically arranged, creating an intuitive browsing experience. Student-centric resources are readily available, including dedicated micro-sites for the library, career development, alumni network, college newsletter, and the SSCBS Innovation and Incubation Foundation (SIIF). The website also provides well-structured information on rankings and accreditations. Setting itself apart, the multilingual SSCBS website offers users an immersive virtual tour of the college. Furthermore, it features text-to-speech functionality, allowing users to listen to the content. Visitors can subscribe to notifications and explore a dynamic timeline that presents the college's rich history.

Transparency is a core value at SSCBS, and the college diligently adheres to all applicable rules and guidelines. The website serves as a comprehensive repository of information related to admissions, regularly updated to provide the latest details. Internal assessment guidelines, academic calendars, time-tables, syllabi, previous year papers, credit structures, and other essential information are readily available on the website.

SSCBS employs a robust ERP system that ensures streamlined management and accessibility for students, teachers, departments, and the library. The ERP system maintains accurate records of internal assessments, with each student having a unique login to access their assessment and attendance details. All the attendances are captured online, which enables the generation of reports student-wise and faculty-wise. Additionally, the ERP facilitates feedback collection, analysis, and subsequent actions. Anonymous faculty feedback, as well as posted internal assessments, are conveniently accessible to students and faculty members through the ERP system.

The Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies website stands as a testament to the college's commitment to excellence, user experience, and transparency. With its visually appealing design, rich content, and extensive functionality, the website exemplifies the college's dedication to providing a seamless online experience for students, faculty, and visitors alike.

Faculty Strength and Engagement

During 2024–25, the college had 29 faculty on roll (27 permanent and 2 ad hoc), supported by 48 guest faculty across the Departments of Management Studies, Financial Studies and Computer Science. Recruitment against sanctioned posts is in progress; the department-wise sanctioned strength, positions filled, vacancies and guest engagement are provided in Annexure 1a -1c.

Our faculty published 36 journal articles this year, spanning AI/ML, operations and supply chains, finance and markets, ESG, information systems, and education. Highlights include papers in Journal of Cleaner Production, Economics Letters, Thunderbird International Business Review, Applied Intelligence, Computational Economics, and the International Journal of System Assurance Engineering and Management, reflecting both methodological depth and industry relevance. **Annexure – 3a**

b) Books, chapters, and proceedings:

This year we produced 9 scholarly outputs in this category: 6 books and 3 chapters in edited volumes and proceedings. The books range from technical texts (Python, statistical software) to management and taxation titles, while the chapters include a Springer contribution on sustainability and a chapter on fintech and DeFi, showing a healthy mix of pedagogy and research translation. **Annexure – 3b**

c) Seminar and conference presentations:

Faculty delivered 17 presentations across national and international forums. Venues included IIMs, IITs, Amity, Bennett University, Jaypee Business School, and the World Finance & Banking Symposium (Abu Dhabi). Topics covered ESG integration, financial inclusion, analytics, and entrepreneurship, indicating strong visibility of our research in diverse communities. **Annexure – 3c**

d) Editorial and professional service:

Faculties held 9 editorial and board roles, including journal editorships and board memberships with Shimur publications, Inderscience, Springer-linked journals, and the Journal of Graphic Era University. These roles strengthened our peer-review ecosystem engagement and widened our networks for collaborative scholarship. **Annexure – 3d**

e) Research projects completed:

The year saw completion of one funded research project under the Institute of Eminence (IoE) at the University of Delhi, focused on circularity in closed-loop supply chains. The project delivered applied insights for sustainable operations and concluded within the stated period. **Annexure – 3e**

f) Invited talks, session chairs, and academiontributions:

Faculty undertook 31 activities as resource persons, session chairs, advisors, or curriculum developers. This includes talks and chairs at international and national conferences, executive and government trainings (NHPC, C-DAC, Delhi Government officials), advisory board service, and curriculum work with NIOS. The breadth shows sustained outreach and knowledge transfer. **Annexure – 3f**

g) Faculty development and training attended:

Faculty completed 13 FDPs/refreshers/workshops, including UGC-MMTTC refresher courses, IoE short-term programs, and capacity-building workshops at TERI, CPDHE, and SSCBS. Focus areas ranged from mathematical sciences and business studies to IKS, case method pedagogy, and publisher-led teaching resources. **Annexure – 3g**

Beyond Classrooms

Student Societies & Leadership Development (Annexure 12-57)

SSCBS runs one of DU's most active co-curricular ecosystems with about 45 student societies across careers, culture, tech, entrepreneurship, outreach, wellness, and environment. Representative professional clubs include ACM-SSCBS, APICS-SSCBS, IFSA Network India, Synergy (Corporate Society), and the Management Interaction Cell; intellectual forums like CBS DebSoc and CBS MUN build speaking, analysis, and diplomacy; creative groups such as The Literary Society, Verve (street play), Fourth Wall Productions, and The Darkroom nurture expression.

Students also learn by running major campus events—especially the annual cultural fest Crescendo—and by serving in the Student Council.

Entrepreneurial leadership is supported by the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) and the in-house SSCBS Innovation & Incubation Foundation (SIIF), which mentors and funds student ventures.

Community Engagement & Social Responsibility

Service and citizenship are integral to campus life. The NSS anchors extension and outreach, Enactus leads social-enterprise projects, and Rotaract coordinates community service. The Eco Club and the Financial Literacy Cell drive environmental stewardship and financial awareness across the student body. GirlUp Ruhi, the Queer Straight Alliance, and the North East Committee foster inclusion, safety, and a strong sense of belonging.

These efforts operate within a documented Extension and Outreach framework and are supported by the college's focus on wellbeing, including access to a practising clinical psychologist for student support. Together, they help students develop empathy, leadership, and accountability while strengthening our campus community.

Global Exposure & International Collaborations

The prestigious Global Entrepreneurship Program in Japan, sponsored by MEXT, Government of Japan, was attended by Dr. Kumar Bijoy and selected students — Samyaa Goyal (BMS), Parth Maniktalia (BMS), and Manav Mahajan (BBAFIA) . They represented India in a fully funded 14-day international exchange in Japan. A total of 240 thousand Japanese yen was given as a scholarship. The program brought together entrepreneurial students from around the world, including India, Japan, Australia, and the UK, for cross-cultural collaboration and immersion in global startup ecosystems.

Students compete on global stages, including podiums at the HSBC/HKU Global Case Competition and BrainWars by Bain & Co., and secure fully sponsored short-term scholarships such as Kansai University (Japan).

Internationally networked societies extend this exposure: 180 Degrees Consulting and Bridges for Enterprises offer cross-border consulting; ACM and APICS connect students to global tech and supply-chain communities; IFSA links finance enthusiasts worldwide; MUN builds multilateral negotiation skills.

Beyond societies, the pedagogy builds global readiness with guest lectures, industry visits, live projects, and internships; IQAC expanded access to world-class teaching content through the full Harvard Business Review Publishing catalogue to strengthen case-based learning and simulations.

Campus and facilities

Infrastructure

SSCBS operates a 5-acre campus with a 500-seat auditorium, four seminar halls, and 35 air-conditioned classrooms equipped with audio-visual facilities. The two-level library, amphitheatre, hostels, cafeteria and mess, underground parking, and on-campus residential units support academic and residential life. Safety is maintained through monitored CCTV and fire-protection systems. Campus-wide accessibility is ensured through ramps and lifts, enabling all students and faculty to use the facilities comfortably.

Sustainability measures include rooftop solar and water-heating systems, an in-house Sewage Treatment Plant (STP), an air-quality monitoring station, and energy-efficient building materials and practices. Academic and administrative infrastructure comprises five computer labs, dedicated examination rooms, nine tutorial rooms, separate faculty rooms, a full floor housing the incubation centre and placement cell, and a separate alumni relations cell.

Facilities for Sports and Cultural Activities

The college places consistent emphasis on students' physical well-being and cultural expression, and treats both as integral to campus life. A half-acre playing field supports regular practice and friendly matches in football, cricket, volleyball, and kabaddi. Indoor facilities enable table tennis, carrom, and chess. A fully equipped open gym on the grounds encourages daily fitness routines for students across programmes. Usage is coordinated by the Sports Committee to ensure equitable access, with schedules shared in advance and basic first-aid available during organised activities.



Cultural activity is anchored by a large open-air stage at one end of the grounds. Student societies use it for rehearsals, auditions, workshops, and full-scale productions throughout the year. It serves as the centerpiece for Crescendo, the annual cultural festival, and supports a steady calendar of performances, competitions, and cross-college collaborations. The same venue adapts well to alumni meets, food festivals, and other community events, allowing large audiences without disrupting academic spaces.

Both sports and cultural facilities are open to all students and are planned with inclusivity in mind. Together, these spaces help students build teamwork, confidence, and leadership while strengthening the college's sense of community.

Akash Ganga, the college auditorium is fully air-conditioned, seats more than 500 people and is set up to conduct a variety of cultural events, conferences and discussions. More focused activities can make use of any of the 4 similarly equipped but slightly smaller (at approximately 100 seats) seminar rooms. At the other end, a garlanded bust of our namesake, Shaheed Sukhdev Thapar and the gaily fluttering national flag provide a touch of poignancy and help to channelize our efforts for greater national good.

Its offerings include mentorship, seed funding, co-working space, investor and industry networks, and a range of capacity-building programs to empower the student and the startup community.

SIIF aims to promote entrepreneurship and entrepreneurial ventures among the students of the host institution (SSCBS) and beyond in an inclusive and beneficial manner. 

- Annalia Beauty Pvt. Ltd. is a mission-driven HealthTech beauty venture that empowers women, especially from Northeast India, through premium beauty and wellness products, services, and training. The brand has built a strong presence in the sector, generating more than ₹12.5 lakhs in revenue in 2024-25.
- **Ai Proff Software Consulting (OPC) Pvt. Ltd.** is tackling real-world livestock challenges with its AI/ML-driven solution, PashuTham. Despite working in limited data environments, the startup created a significant impact in agriculture, achieving ₹15 lakhs in revenue in 2024-25.

Coordinated by Dr. Rishi Rajan Sahay and Dr. Narander Kumar Nigam the workshop aimed to equip students with strong database management skills and advanced SQL query writing abilities.

The program received over 70 applications, and a select group of students was chosen to ensure personalized guidance. Sessions were conducted by Dr. Bhuvneshwar Prasad Sharma (President, Vigor Council) and Dr. Sangeeta Yadav (University of Delhi). The curriculum covered SQL fundamentals, joins, subqueries, indexing, transactions, and integration with Python and web applications. Students worked on real-world case studies, including designing a database for an e-commerce platform.

The initiative received excellent feedback and significantly strengthened students' technical and analytical proficiency, preparing them for data-intensive roles in business and technology.

Web Design and Development

Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies organized a week-long —Web Design and Development Workshop from 27 –31 January 2025. Coordinated by Prof. Shikha Gupta and Dr. Narander Kumar Nigam, the workshop aimed to equip students with practical skills to build and enhance standalone web applications.

The program received over 50 applications, and 40 students were selected to ensure interactive, hands-on learning. Sessions were conducted by Ms. Ruchi Singhal and Ms. Ayushi Gupta (Assistant Professors, SSCBS) and Mr. Rishav Raj (Industry Expert). Participants learned to create functional websites with registration forms, store and manage form data, and build interactive

visualizations using third-party libraries. The course followed a structured, day-wise format emphasizing end-to-end programming concepts.

The workshop received an enthusiastic response and helped students strengthen their web development skills, preparing them for technology-oriented roles and projects.

Generative AI in Finance

Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies organized a 15-hour hands-on workshop titled —Generative AI in the Financial Sectorl in February 2025. Coordinæed by Dr. Sushmita Rai, Dr. Narander Kumar Nigam and Dr. Amit Kumar the workshop was held on 12, 19, 24, 25 February & 6 th March, from 3:00–6:00 PM in the 4th Floor Lab.

The course received 100+ applications, with 40 students selected to ensure interactive sessions. Conducted by Mr. Havish, Founder of Havish M Consulting, the workshop trained students in using ChatGPT, Claude, and Google Colab for financial analysis, automation, and decision-making. Participants explored AI-driven stock trading, risk management, fraud detection, credit risk assessment, and portfolio optimization through real-world case studies and hands-on exercises.

The program was well-received and significantly enhanced students‘ understanding of AI applications in finance, boosting their readiness for data-driven financial roles.

Harvard Business Publishing Education: Access and Outcomes

Our college held a one-year subscription to Harvard Business Publishing Education from September 2, 2024 to September 1, 2025, giving faculty and students access to articles, book chapters, case studies, simulations, online courses, Harvard ManageMentor micro-credentials, tutorials, and other resources across management and finance. During this period, faculty created 46 coursepacks for e-learning materials and 71 coursepacks for case studies, spanning areas such as negotiation and leadership, quantitative techniques, operations management, business strategy, financial management, and marketing case analysis.

In addition, more than 1,300 students enrolled in 41 Harvard ManageMentor micro-credential courses on topics including crisis management, networking, innovation and creativity, talent development, digital intelligence, time management, business case development, global collaboration, and writing skills.

Extension and Outreach Activities

Livelihood and Women Empowerment Initiatives

Project Jyoti: A livelihood initiative enabling underprivileged women to set up micro candle-making enterprises was developed. Eco-friendly production and entrepreneurship were promoted in collaboration with 3–4 NGOs. The project was shortlisted as a finalist at *Changeathon* for innovation and sustainability.

Project Utsav: Support was extended to the potter community through field visits, sales facilitation, and market linkage. Approximately 300 *kulhad*s were sold via campus-based partnerships, promoting traditional craftsmanship and sustainable consumption.

Health and Hygiene Awareness

Project Sanjeevta: Awareness was raised regarding disease prevention, hygiene practices, and first-aid readiness, emphasizing preventive healthcare in underserved communities.

Fortis Escorts Partnership: Free medical check-ups, ECGs, vaccinations, and basic treatments were extended to women and children in homeless shelters.

Project Chahat: Awareness on maternal and child health was promoted through digital and on-ground sessions. Sanitary napkins were distributed, and expert-led discussions were conducted on menstruation, maternal nutrition, and hygiene.

Animal Welfare and Environmental Responsibility

Project Furry: Visits to Gaushalas and awareness campaigns on animal care were carried out via social media platforms.

Dog Collar Activity: Reflective neon collars were distributed to 20 stray dogs in Rohini to enhance visibility and reduce accidents during low-light hours.

Plantation Drive: Over 40 saplings were planted at a Rajouri Garden school with the participation of more than 100 students and 16 volunteers, promoting environmental consciousness.

Education, Awareness & Skill Development

CUET-UG Awareness Session: Held at a government school in Shahbad, the session benefited 100 students by guiding them on entrance procedures, exam structure, and doubt resolution.

Project Saksham: Career guidance and information on skill development and government schemes were provided to individuals across age groups. A Wishing Wall event was also organized to help fulfill children's aspirations.

Project Nayaab: Foundational education and interactive literacy sessions were conducted for underprivileged children, supported by the distribution of study materials.

Project Unnati: Technical skill training on digital literacy, financial awareness, and soft skills was delivered to household staff to improve their employability and confidence.

Community Outreach and Welfare Activities

Visits to Educational NGOs: Road safety sessions were conducted for children, focusing on traffic rules and safe behavior.

Project Ehsaas: A decentralized food and clothing donation drive was executed across multiple neighborhoods to serve shelters and communities in need.

Project Muskaan: Children at a Rohini-based NGO participated in teddy coloring, dance, and snack distribution, creating a joyful environment.

Rang De: Value-based murals were painted alongside children at an NGO, combining creativity, learning, and visual engagement.

Project Udaan: A visit to a special school was conducted, involving interactive sessions and shared moments with differently-abled children

Bisleri Association: Plastic bottles were donated for recycling into PET fabric, reinforcing responsible disposal and reuse.

Sensitization and Social Awareness

Looking Ahead

Strategic Priorities & Future Vision

Deepen career readiness and academic enrichment. IQAC has already laid out a road map and run targeted actions this year—expanding student workshops with alumni and industry experts, tightening the summer-internship process with clear policies and evaluation, and strengthening mentorship and counselling access. We'll carry these forward as core quality priorities.

Sustain world-class learning resources. The HBP Education subscription (articles, cases, simulations and courses) runs through 2 September 2024–1 September 2025; maintaining this level of access—or an equivalent—is a priority for classroom rigour and case-based pedagogy.

Modernise digital and library infrastructure. With 206 computers, 133 campus Wi-Fi access points and layered network security already in place, our focus is to keep uptime high and expand coverage where needed. On the library side, we'll continue to scale discovery services (NLIST, DELNET, DU eLibrary/ONOS), automation tools (KOHA), and student internships that foster research skills.

Advance a greener campus. We'll build on existing rooftop solar and solar water-heating infrastructure and on student-led sustainability programs (plantation drives, the 30-Day Environment Challenge, and the annual Prakriti fest).

Scale entrepreneurship and innovation. SIIF will continue to mentor and fund early-stage ventures across HealthTech, EdTech, AgroTech, Sustainability and D2C—building on this year's footprint of 56 onboarded startups and revenue-generating success stories.

Strengthen placements and progression. With a strong recruiter base and clear CDC processes, the emphasis remains on higher-order skills for consulting, finance, analytics and tech, while continuing to support students pursuing higher education.

Broaden global exposure. We'll look to deepen international experiences, building on scholarships and short-term programs already accessed by students this year.

Commitment to Nation-Building & India's Growth

Ascend, our annual global supply chain case competition, saw record-breaking participation from over 1500+ students across top institutions including IIMs and DU colleges. The case challenge, centered on semiconductor supply chain risks (as shown), tested strategic thinking around geopolitical disruptions and AI-driven demand surges. Live Projects Piramal Foundation

In partnership with the Piramal Foundation, our team undertook a high-impact project aimed at strengthening public education systems through evidence-based decision-making. We analyzed datasets from over 10,000 government schools, evaluating enrolment patterns, infrastructure availability, teacher qualifications, and student-teacher ratios. Using Excel-based statistical models across 7+ performance indicators, we categorized 100+ districts by severity of intervention needed. The findings formed the basis of a policy brief submitted to the Chief Minister, outlining urgent reforms to increase enrolment and reduce dropout rates in underserved districts. The brief advocated for targeted resource allocation, capacity building for educators, and infrastructure upgrades in the most vulnerable regions.

Outcomes: The project deepened our understanding of education policy design, taught us how to translate raw data into actionable governance insights, and demonstrated how grassroots analytics can directly shape state-level policy decisions.

Patanjali Foods

This consulting project focused on redesigning Patanjali's national supply and distribution network to enhance efficiency, scalability, and sustainability. After conducting an extensive assessment of over

100 depots and 50+ regional operations, we identified critical inefficiencies in sourcing, warehousing, and last-mile delivery.

Through a comparative analysis with industry competitors and internal operational mapping, we developed a 3–5-year strategic roadmap to modernize the supply chain. Our recommendations emphasized the adoption of real-time inventory tracking systems, modernization of equipment and a stronger emphasis on sustainable sourcing and fleet optimization to reduce transit time and operational waste.

Outcomes: The project culminated in a comprehensive restructuring plan with the potential to significantly cut operational costs, improve delivery timelines, and enhance Patanjali's responsiveness to market demand. Team members gained hands-on exposure to high-level supply chain strategy, real-world distribution challenges, and the role of sustainability in FMCG logistics

Research Reports (May- July)

AI in Supply Chain Management

This report explored how AI and Generative AI are reshaping supply chains through enhanced forecasting, automation, and real-time decision-making. Featuring global case studies, we highlighted AI's role in improving agility and reducing operational inefficiencies.

Outcomes: Identified up to 30% improvement in forecast accuracy and 40% reduction in costs; offered a roadmap for AI integration in supply chains.

Last-Mile Delivery

Focusing on speed and customer satisfaction, this report analyzed innovative last-mile logistics models such as micro-fulfillment and crowdsourced delivery. It emphasized the link between logistics strategy and brand experience.

Outcomes: Demonstrated potential to reduce last-mile costs by 25% and improve NPS by 20 points; outlined strategies for operational excellence in urban delivery.

E-Commerce Supply Chains

We examined how leading retailers are building agile, omnichannel supply chains to meet evolving consumer demands. The report addressed integration across warehousing, inventory, and logistics in a digital-first retail environment.

Outcomes: Found up to 35% increase in fulfillment efficiency and reduced churn; provided actionable insights for e-commerce supply chain design.

Supply Chain Decoded Posts

As part of its mission to bridge theory with real-world industry insights, the society launched *Supply Chain Decoded*", a content series that was widely appreciated by students and professionals alike—garnering over 10,000+ organic impressions across platforms. Each post dissected the supply chain strategies of global giants, offering brand-specific insights, comparative benchmarking, and innovative recommendations.

Nike

We decoded Nike's vast global supply chain, focusing on its Direct-to-Consumer (DTC) evolution, contract manufacturing network, and responsive logistics. By benchmarking against 10+ global competitors, the analysis revealed key differentiators in Nike's demand sensing and inventory flow.

Highlights: Suggested reducing lead times through regional warehousing and predictive analytics, while improving cost-efficiency through tech-enabled vendor collaboration.

Blinkit

This post unraveled the hyperlocal logistics engine powering Blinkit, analyzing its dark store model, rider network, and ERP integration across 30+ cities.

Highlights: Identified major bottlenecks in urban clusters and proposed high-impact solutions like EV-based last-mile delivery, pop-up fulfillment hubs in Tier 2 cities, and a circular resale model to drive sustainability and improve service coverage.

Coca-Cola

We took a deep dive into Coca-Cola's end-to-end procurement and sustainability initiatives, focusing on its use of AI-powered forecasting, real-time inventory systems, and eco-conscious packaging.

Highlights: Showcased the brand's shift to 100% recyclable PET bottles, reverse logistics innovations, and cost-optimization through local sourcing and predictive demand models.







<p>The Basera Volunteer Visit on August 29, 2024, saw 50–60 college students visit the Rain Basera Shelter in Connaught Place. Volunteers conducted painting activities, dance sessions, and</p>	

interactive games, creating a joyful and inclusive environment for the children. This initiative helped instill empathy and a sense of community service among participants.

On October 18, 2024, a collection drive was conducted at Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies in collaboration with Pehchaan Street Foundation. The drive received an overwhelming response with contributions from 150–180 students, including books, notebooks, and other educational materials. These items were distributed on October 20, 2024, to children near Venus Public School, benefiting 80–100 underprivileged children and reinforcing the value of educational equity.

The society set up a sustainable product stall on October 25, 2024, at Shaheed Rajguru College for Women. Products such as notebooks, diyas, stubble pots, and wall hangings were displayed to encourage environmentally conscious choices. The same day, a community visit to the refugee colony in Majnu ka Tilla was undertaken to assess the living conditions of the Pakistani Hindu community and plan empowerment-based interventions. Later, on February 2, 2025, the Basera Closing Visit marked the culmination of months of engagement at the Rain Basera Shelter. Volunteers organized storytelling, dancing, painting, and distributed chocolates to around 50–60 children

A product stall at Bennett University was set up on February 10, 2025, where more than 500 attendees engaged with our eco-friendly product range. This was followed by sustainability awareness sessions at Kendriya Vidyalaya Masjid Moth and

Government Boys Senior Secondary School on February 11 and 14, respectively. Around 40–50 students in each school were introduced to mindful paper consumption practices. On February 14, the team also conducted a Kaagazi session at Government Girls Senior Secondary School, reaching 150–200 students through interactive activities focused on paper waste management.

The educational journey continued with another Kaagazi workshop on February 17, 2025, at Bal Bharti Public School in Pitampura, where 150–200 students were introduced to the importance of recycling and sustainability. On April 16, 2025, the society hosted Abhivyakt, a social business plan competition at SSCBS, attracting over 100 participants who developed business plans addressing critical social issues through innovation and sustainability. Finally, a community visit to Mansarovar Park II on July 3, 2025, aimed at identifying employment and skill-building opportunities for marginalized groups, saw the participation of 50–60 students committed to sustainable social upliftment.



It reinforced the importance of spreading positivity and made for an impactful celebration during Valentine's Week, with active participation from the college community.
- Project Ehsaas: For Propose Day, we organized a decentralized food and clothes donation drive. 
